The following is the Grappler Creek, Banfield, property mentioned to you where both the registered owners are dead.

Catalogue No. 501: Parcel No. 1 (D.D. 63267-I) of Block "B" of Section 20, Township 1, Barclay District, Plan 2486. Certificate of Title No. 70104-I in names of Iwakichi KAKIUCHI (died at Banfield, 1/1/1942), File 14090, and Ichitaro NARIWA (died "13 years ago"), File 14127. Our records show the families of the two men to consist of:

The land is assessed at \$100.00 and Improvements at \$900.00, the latter apparently being the house Iwakichi KAKIUCHI lived in with his family and of which the son (Iwakasu) claims ownership.

Another house, owned by a nephew of Ichitaro NARIWA (Yoshikazu KAWAGUCHI, F.1732) was for some time treated as being on this parcel of land but now appears to be on adjacent Parcel No. 2.



In reply to your letter of April 9th, we wish to advise that the radio surrendered in the name of your brother, Yoshio NARIWA, has been sold in accordance with the Custodian's policy of liquidation. The net proceeds of this sale amounted to \$24.49, which will be placed to your brother's credit when the receipt, received from the police at the time the radio was surrendered, is sent to this office as evidence of your brother's ownership of this radio.

The camera is in our hands. If your brother will notify us that he wishes this camera sent to you, and will send us the receipt given by the police when the camera was surrendered, we will mail the camera to you. Mailing costs, which would amount to a few cents, would be charged to your brother's account.
