GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 6871

Re: Toyoko KOBAYASHI

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 28, 1942. She was evacuated on August 31, 1942. In her declaration she declared ownership of no property of any kind left in the protected area.

The Singer Sewing Machine Company, Victoria, B. C. reported a claim in the amount of \$77.50 against this woman, being the unpaid balance due on the purchase price of a sewing machine, which was held by the company. On December 10, 1942, the Singer Sewing Machine Company informed this office that the account had been paid in full, and that the machine had been shipped to Mrs. Kobayashi, at Slocan City.

The file reveals no ownership of any other property of any kind whatsoever.

No other liabilities are shown on this file, but the file of this woman's husband, Kansaburo KOBAYASHI, File 9388, shows a claim filed by the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, in connection with funeral expenses of an infant daughter of this couple; the claim being for \$30.00. As no assets of the parents are under the control of the Custodian, we are notifying the Department of Labour that this office can take no action in regard to their claim.
