

GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Tei (Mrs. Hisakichi) SUYAMA, #06398

On April 28, 1942, this woman signed a Declaration stating that she owned no property of any kind left in the protected area. On November 17, 1942, however, she signed a Custodian release for 3 mattresses, a hatchet and Japanese plane and two quart jars of jam left at House #4, No. 1 Japanese town, Cumberland, B.C. Nothing further appears on this file in regard to this Custodian release and in the absence of evidence to the contrary we assume that shipment was made.

The chattels belonging to this family were declared by Hisakichi SUYAMA, husband of this woman, and these are covered by the copy of the Personal Property Summary which is filed directly behind this paper.

File 6876 reveals no other property and no liabilities are shown in this file.

In his declaration to the Custodian on April 17, 1942, this man declared a sewing machine, bicycle, trunk, 2 boxes of dishes and kitchenware, all of which we believe were shipped to him.

He declared a box containing school books. There is no record of what has happened to these.

He declared mattresses and it is shown that his wife, file 6876, requested shipment of 3 mattresses on November 17, 1942, when she also requested shipment of a hatchet, a plane and a 2-quart jar of jam. The 2 stoves, two of the 4 beds, the bureau, book-stand and table declared were sold. The desks declared are not accounted for. A counter, 2 side hs, 5 chairs and a box of effects and a number of smaller articles which were declared were sold.

The total proceeds from the sale of chattels identified as the property of this man amounted to \$26.20 which was credited to his account.

This man declared four \$5.00 War Saving Certificates in his own possession. This did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no further property of any kind.
