Reference to your claim for \$500 against the Surrey Berry Growers Co-operation Ass'n. This office has taken the matter up with the Surrey Berry Growers Co-operation Association and have been informed by Mr. Zennosuke Inouye, Reg. #03243, Ex-president of the Association that this claim of \$500 was reduced to \$300 on July 17, 1942. Mr. Inouye produced a receipt from the Bank of Montreal to support his statement. This receipt shows that \$200 was sent by the bank to T. Imahashi at Box 24, Raymond, Alta. We are informed that T. Imahashi is your uncle, and his address is the correct address for mailing any funds forwarded to you.

Kindly let us know at your very earliest convenience if the above statement by Inouye is correct.

Inouye also claims that the question of the balance of \$300 still unpaid was to be left in abeyance until after the war.

RE: Surrey Berry Growers
Co-operative Association
R.R. No. 4, NEW WESTMINSTER, B. C.

I am presently endeavouring to obtain access to the records of the above association, or in the alternative, some satisfactory information relative to the operations carried on, with a view to recommending cancellation of Sales Tax License No. 4 which was issued on April 1st last in respect of the taxable operation of fruit processing.

The cancellation of this license is now required in view of the fact that the affairs of the association have been wound up.

In response to a communication from the Collector of Customs, New Westminster, B. C., you wrote him on the 18th instant explaining your connection with the association to the time you were evacuated on June 3rd last.

I shall be glad if you can give me the following information:-

- (1) Did the association process any fruit in S.O.2 during the months of April, May, and June last?
- (2) If so, were sales made, and to whom?

Sales of fruit so processed are taxable at the rate of 8% on the selling price, unless they are exported by the association or sold in Canada to licensed manufacturers for use in further manufacture, in which cases they would be exempt from the tax at time of sale providing the association could produce the necessary evidence, that is, Form B. 13 for export sales, or a certificate from another licensed manufacturer claiming exemption from tax on the ground that they were being purchased for further manufacture.

For your information this tax has to be filed and paid monthly by manufacturers, and a "Nil" return is required to be filed in any month when no tax is payable.

No returns were filed for April and May last, now overdue, but it is appreciated that as you were not advised on this matter when taking over the liquidation of the association's affairs late in May you would not be aware of this requirement.

I shall be glad therefore if you will supply me with any information you have relative to the matters mentioned to assist me in bringing them to a conclusion.
