

GENERAL SUMMARY

Jukichi ONISHI, Dec'd.

Jukichi ONISHI died at Kaslo on July 20, 1942. He was survived by one son, Toshio, file #8980; and three daughters, Haruyo (Mrs. M.) Hattori, file #2715; Fusaye (Mrs.) Koyama, file #9532; and Shizue Onishi, file #10553.

The only asset of the deceased revealed on the file is an insurance policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co. From a telephone conversation with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co., today, it is learned that the death benefit under this policy was paid to the beneficiary, Toshio Onishi, in 1942.

A claim was filed against the deceased by the Provincial Mental Hospital and T. B. Unit for an unknown amount to cover hospitalization of Shigeo Onishi, son of Jukichi Onishi, in the Provincial T. B. hospital. Another claim for hospitalization was filed against Shigeo Onishi by the Royal Columbian Hospital in the sum of \$112.35. It was learned from a telephone conversation with the office of the Collector of Institutional Revenue that Shigeo Onishi was 27 years of age when he entered the hospital in 1935 and it would therefore appear that Jukichi Onishi is not legally responsible for either of these debts. The R. C. M. P. have no record of Shigeo Onishi and it is presumed that he died prior to evacuation.

A claim for the sum of \$75.00 was filed by the B. C. Security Commission to cover the cost of the funeral of the deceased. They were advised by this office that the deceased had no assets of which we had knowledge from which the claim could be paid but that his son, Toshio, had received payment of death benefit under a Manufacturers Life Insurance policy on the life of his father.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

Re: Shigeo ONISHI

Reference is made to your claim against Shigeo Onishi. At the time you filed this claim with us, you gave the name of his closest relative, Jukichi Onishi, his Father.

Mr. Onishi, Senior, died at Kaslo, B.C. on July 20, 1942, as a result of an accident and his burial expenses were paid by the British Columbia Security Commission and amounted to \$75.00. We have notified the British Columbia Security Commission that Mr. Jukichi Onishi declared to us on April 29th that he had a life insurance policy for \$1,000.00 with the Manufacturers' Life Insurance Company and as the British Columbia Security Commission are presumably acting as administrators for the estate of the late Mr. Onishi, you will no doubt wish to discuss with the British Columbia Security Commission without delay the matter of obtaining satisfaction in connection with your claims.

The Custodian's Office does not have and has not had under its control any assets belonging to the late Mr. Onishi.

Thank you very much for your letter dated August 19th placing with us a claim for \$75.00 covering the burial expenses of Mr. Onishi who died at Kaslo, B.C. on July 20th, 1942, which you desire us to recover from Mr. Onishi's estate.

In referring to our file in connection with the affairs of the late Mr. Onishi, we find that he declared to us on April 29th that he had a life insurance policy with the Manufacturers' Life Insurance Company for \$1,000.00 with his son, Toshio, named as beneficiary, that the policy number was unknown, but that the policy itself was in the possession of the late Mr. Onishi. Our files also indicate that his wife, Shika, at the time Mr. Onishi registered with us on April 29th, was no longer living.

As we have no funds under our control, nor have we ever had any funds under our control belonging to Mr. Onishi, it occurs to us that in the event the B.C. Security Commission are acting as administrators of the estate of the late Mr. Onishi, that you will no doubt desire to secure probate, the necessary Death Certificate, and thereafter to take up the matter with the Manufacturers' Life Insurance Company who presumably will effect settlement of your claim, together with any other claims which may be made by the Provincial Mental Hospital and Government Tuberculosis Units, who also notified us that they have a claim against the late Mr. Onishi's son, Shigeo.

We have received an enquiry, through the B. C. Security Commission, relative to your late father's estate.

Your father, according to the information we have, left no assets as the property was registered in the name of your brother, Toshio, and as beneficiary he also received the payment of your father's life insurance policy.

Two unpaid liabilities appear on your father's file, the Royal Columbian Hospital - \$112.35 and the B. C. Security Commission - \$75.00, covering funeral expenses.
