

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

November 14, 1946.

Declared April 29/42

Evacuated May 17/42.

CHATELS:

The declarant stated that he left "Household furniture, bedding, kitchen utensils in the custody of his sister at Steveston, B.C."

The sisters file, Miss Haruko MORISHITA, file 5366, reveals that no mention is made of these effects and although Miss MORISHITA'S chattels were sold at the Custodian auctions it is impossible to identify anything belonging to Teranishi.

Miss Teranishi's 6 sewing machines were sold and the proceeds realized appear on her file #6887.

LIFE INSURANCE:

The declarant had in his possession a \$500.00 policy #682938 in the Sun Life Assurance Co., the beneficiary being his wife, Nao Tomekichi TERANISHI requested the cash surrender value of this policy and the company on September 20th, 1944, forwarded the Custodian a cheque payable to him in the amount of \$425.43, this was sent to him on October 3rd, 1945. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.


SPECIFIED

ARTICLES: Although it was not declared, Tomekichi TERANISHI surrendered his fishing vessel "T.T" to the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee and it was sold by them to Provincial Cannery, Rivers Inlet for \$250.00. Supervision costs of \$5.00 were deducted and the balance paid to Tomekichi TERANISHI on September 17th, 1942.

No other personal property other than the above are revealed on file.



You will remember that the premises at 89 Moncton Street belonging to the two Morishitas were rented by them to a Mrs. Morrival. Part of the agreement was to store some of the dressmaking equipment belonging to these Japanese and consisting among other things, of twelve Singer sewing machines.

Mrs. Teranishi declared six sewing machines and other items left with her sister, Mrs. Morishita at Steveston. It seems probable that these six are included in the twelve covered by the agreement referred to above, but we should like you to see if you can confirm or deny this.

We are making this enquiry because the Security Commission have asked if the two Teranishis have any resources. If there is any other furniture or effects belonging to the Teranishis, we would be interested to know about these.


