We are now writing with further reference to ours of June 17th which you will recall was in answer to a letter of yours querying the prices for which your equipment was sold. Some more items have now come to hand and we have credited your account with the total of \$138.00 as per our enclosure. Of this you have received \$78.00 leaving \$60.00 to your credit which can be sent to you on request.

This is the only equipment of yours that we can trace and as you did not declare any fishing equipment when you were evacuated, it is difficult for us to do any more in this matter.

Dear Sirs:-

Re: Jack Waichiro KOSAKA

On going through our records, we find what we believe may be duplicate payments from you for the same pieces of equipment. Your invoice of January 19th, 1943, pages 28 and 29, shows the purchase of four pieces of Manila rope for \$20.00 and a reel of 3/4" second-hand cable for \$40.00, both items belonging to the above Japanese. Mr. Robinson issued receipts on January 13th, Nos. 2231 and 2232, for similar items at similar prices to your good selves. Would you kindly check?

We shall be rather relieved if these are not duplicate payments since the Japanese claimed equipment of this nature (130 fathoms 1 1/2" line and 300 fathoms 3/4" cable) valued at approximately \$300.00 and it would, therefore, appear that even if there is no duplication, our selling prices are low. Would you please let us know about this?

We might mention that we have about ten other items which rather appear to be duplications and we will be pleased to give you particulars of these on request.

Dear Sir -

I have received the sum of \$78.00 from you for the sale of my fishing equipments, but of this amount is for cable, lines and beam trawl left at Vancouver Cannery, will you please get me full value for them.

Here are the list of equipments and their value when I bought them.

130 fathoms (780 ft) practically new 1 1/4 inch line; casting 20¢ per 2 1/2 ft. —	\$2.40
300 fathom (1800 ft) 3/4 inch cable and steel drum, —	\$240.00
Beam trawl, lines etc	40.00

The fishing equipments I left at Vancouver Cannery had valuation of over \$342.00. At present valuation, these are worth more than half price, but even if I were to get half of the valuation, I should get more than just \$78.00.

Will you please refer this to B.C. Packers and ask them to give me the full amount of the proceeds.
