CHATTELS: The above Japanese registered with this office on the 30th April, 1942, and he declared at that time that he was leaving household furniture and farm implements at 322 - 14th Avenue, Haney. This property was inventoried by our fieldmen on the 11th November, 1942, and it was noted that the chattels inventoried at that time were of very low value.

There is a memorandum on this file dated 3rd March, 1943, that the house had been broken into and ransacked.

Nothing was therefore removed to auction, as the remaining chattels did not warrant the expense of handling.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE: The Maple Ridge Co-operative Exchange remitted the sum of \$76.91 from crop sales to TATEISHI's credit on the 1st October, 1942.

Replying to your enquiry of the 24th instant relative to subject dapanese, we have to advise that according to our records lateishi sold his berry crop in May 1942 for \$400.00 and that he received \$200.00 at the time the deal was made (this sum was not deposited with us as he states) and was given a cheque for \$152.95 post dated to September 1st. We believe he still holds this cheque, as we wrote to him some months ago to send it in to this office for us to deal with it on his behalf, but to date he apparently has not done so as we have not received it. We ask that you kindly have him send in this cheque, so that we might endeavour to effect collection.

To your information, the farm property which Tateishi claims ownership to is actually owned by his wife, Tsuge. The property consists of approximately 25 seres of assessed value, land \$700.00, improvements \$500.00, clear title. The property is not leased at present, but we anticipate that we will find a tenant for it in the very near future.


