In megard to the third paragraph of your letter of detcher 27,1947, which decls with two redic receipts and a radio belonging to Br. Sanjiro Hitida, the Statements sade in your letter do not agree with the information on file berea

Tou state that two recompts were taken to the Royal Canadian Housted Police at Hamilton which they had to used to the Custodian. In segmed to this, the Royal Canadian Housted Police cent to this attice a radio receipt for a sedio surrendered by Ricaburo Hamagachi on behalf of Sanjire Hikida. The police informed use that you had stated that this receipt had been given to your nother was gave it to you. The police informed this affice that you wished to know if you each obtain this radio. The report from the Royal Canadian Housted Police and no mention of any receipt, other than that for the radio of Sanjiro Hikida.

Upon receiving the receipt for Hr. Hillide's radio from the colles, we stoke the filteds informing him that the receipt for the radio currentered on his behalf had been turned in to the police by you. We informed him that you had stoked that the receipt had been given to your nother, she had given the receipt to you, and that you had asked if the radio could be sent to you. To saited the Himself is he had sold or given the radio to your nother.

On July 27,1945, so received a reply from Mr. Hitida stating that he had not given or said the radio to your nother, and stating that he was the legal owner of the radio. He sated that the funds from the said of the radio to sent to him.

Our records show no no complaints from Mr. Hikida, and our letter to you, of August 9,1945, did not mention my complaints from Mr.Hikida. We did inform you that Mr.Hikida had said, "Please be notified that the radio was not given or sold to Mrs. Sute Kondo, and that I am still the legal owner of it." You state that Mr. Hikida's radio was in your name and that your nother has told you that curtage of \$5.00 was paid, and that you wrote us that Hr.Hikida had not paid the east age expanse. In agard to this, as we have already stated, the receipt for the radio belonging to Hr.Hikida showed that the radio had been turned over to the police by Mr.Ricaburo Kamquchi on behalf of Mr.Sanjiro Hikida. There is nothing on the receipt to show that you had any connection with this matter there is nothing in the receipt to show that you had any connection with this matter at all. In regard to the cartage expense of \$5.00, your letter of October 27th was the first intimation this office received that you had any claim against Mr.Hikida. If Mr. Hikida was indebted to you, you should have notified the Custodian on April 1,1942, then you reported to the Gustodian regarding your property. Another opportunity was given to you to report this claim at the time you signed a statement of your assets and liabilities, during the period of your interment. It neither time, however, did you mention that Mr. Hikida was indebted to you. In fact you stated that you had no debtore. As you are mure, Mr.Hikida has been repatriated to Japan.
