The B. C. Security Commission have asked us (March 8th, 1945, on file 8245) to send Mrs. Kitamura (who owned the refrigerating equipment that was recently discovered) \$25.00 on or about the 20th of each month. Normally I could ask the Accounts to make up a requisition and bring it to you for signature each month but from the attached letter you will see that there are some outstanding claims against her deceased husband. The Neon Products' claim at least is obviously a claim against the business assets and dependant on what Mrs. Kitamura answers, should probably be paid. The other two claims are probably not so important and if Mrs. Kitamura denies knowledge of them, you could probably consult Mr. Johnston and close the deceased husband's file.

Once the matter of the claims is settled all you need do is send the Accounts a memorandum asking them to remit \$25.00 on or about the 20th of each month to Mrs. Kitamura.

We regret that we are rather late in sending the above lady her monthly cheque for \$25.00 which should have been sent on the 20th of May as per yours of March 24th. We will see that this is remitted more promptly in future. One reason for the delay is that we had expected to hear from Mrs. Kitamura about the claims against her and her husband.

We have now received yours of June 4th and comment on this as follows.

(1) I.O.U.s for \$725.00. The present credit balance of Mrs. Kitamura is \$1755.39 less the claims mentioned below totalling approximately \$200.00. If you agree, we have no objection to sending Mrs. Kitamura or her creditors the amounts shown in your enclosure.

(2) We note that Mrs. Kitamura agrees to payment of the claim against her from the City of Vancouver for scavenging and are attending to this.

(3) Claims against her deceased husband. These are as follows.

(a) Neon Products of Western Canada Limited.

Less credit for unearned maintenance	<u>28.80</u>

The contract was originally for thirty-six monthly payments of \$10.00 each for signs reading "Sea Foods - Fish and Chips" and "Soft Ice Cream" at 344 Powell Street. We really think



this claim should be paid and should be glad to hear if Mrs. Kitamura agrees to it.

(b) The B. C. Electric have a claim of \$2.16 addressed to her husband at 293 Alexander.

(c) Debt of \$75.00 claimed by Iwazo Sugiman who formerly lived at 249 Princess Avenue and was employed by the Continental Daily News. We have no way of knowing whether this was a personal debt or incurred on behalf of the business which Mr. and Mrs. Kitamura ran together and should be glad of her comments on this.

Zenkuro KITAMURA died at Slocan on October 8, 1944. He is survived by his widow, Masae, file #8245; two sons, Zenichi and Kenji; and three daughters, Hatsue, Shigeno and Kikuno.

The only asset declared by the deceased was a \$100.00 Victory Bond which was left in the owner's possession.

The following claims were filed against Zenkuro KITAMURA:

1. Meac Products of Western Canada Ltd.....\$131.20
2. Iwazo SUGIMAN..... 75.00
3. Takazo WATANABE..... 300.00
4. B. C. Electric Railway Co..... 2.16  
(293 Alexander St.)
5. B. C. Security Commission..... 80.00  
(funeral expenses, Zenkuro KITAMURA)

These claims were all paid by Mrs. KITAMURA, widow of Zenkuro KITAMURA, except the B. C. Electric claim. This was denied by Mrs. KITAMURA on the grounds that they were never located at 293 Alexander Street. The B. C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd. was advised accordingly on July 31, 1945.
