We have heard from Mrs. Yasuo Isoshima^{*} that she has some things hidden on the premises of her husband (whose 'JP' form I attach) at Whonneck. She asks that we record this and gives the following information:-

Will you kindly instruct Mr. Morrison to take off wall board and take proper records of as the property be disposed of.
