GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 7106

July 18, 1946.

Re: Kiyuchi AKASE, Reg. No. 08821

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 30, 1942, in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area. He died on January 26, 1944.

The R.C.M.P. reported that this man was the owner of a boat. However our records show that his boat was sold prior to the outbreak of war with Japan.

The account of this man was credited with the sum \$3.00 received as refund of B.C. Electric Railway Co. security deposit for light. This amount being remitted to the Department of Labour today to be applied on claim they filed for the expense of this man's funeral.

The Vancouver General Hospital filed a claim for \$401.60 on April 21, 1942 but claim sheet of November 6, 1942 shows this claim paid in full.

This file reveals no other property or liabilities of any kind.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

Approval of the transfer of title was given by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee on June 27, 1942, in order that the purchaser could obtain a licence.

Only the surname and initial^{of Japanese} are given. It is therefore possible that this may not be the boat referred to by the RCMP.
