Mrs. Hayden, address 342 Alexander St.,
daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kaichi Imada and married to a
white man, called on February 10th with:

(1) A letter from Mrs. Kaichi Imada asking
for payment to Mrs. Hayden of \$41.00 wages due from Jen-
sen, tenant of her and her husband's property in Haney.
This is actually credited to the husband's account, but
should, I consider, be disbursed to Mrs. Hayden and a
requisition is attached. It appears from the files that
this payment was at least partly due to Mrs. Kaichi
Imada for work on the strawberry farm.

(2) (Part of the same letter) A request that
we hand the camera of Toshio Imada to Mrs. Hayden. I
propose to do this (the camera is in my drawer having
been handed to this office by Mr. Boothe) and shall obtain
a receipt from Mrs. Hayden.

(3) Letter from Yoshiki Imada asking about
Workmen's Compensation due to him. This I shall answer
direct.

Finally, Mrs. Hayden raised some question
about rents due from her father's farm and this will be
explained to her when she calls to pick up the camera.
