GENERAL SUMMARY

Suyeno IMADA, Dec'd.

Suyeno IMADA died at Essondale on August 8, 1945. She was survived by her husband, Yoshitaro, file #6995; one son, George, a minor; and two daughters, Kiyoko, file #7144, and Matsumi, file #12777.

In her original declaration, the deceased declared no assets but, in a subsequent declaration signed at Hastings Park on September 10, 1942, she submitted a list of chattels which she said were left at her home in Whonnock. According to a Memorandum on file, the chattels of Yoshitaro IMADA were moved by him across the road to the home of his brother Kaichi IMADA before he evacuated as he had leased his property. The house of Kaichi IMADA burned to the ground and the contents were completely destroyed. It is presumed that the chattels declared by Suyeno IMADA were also moved to the home of Kaichi IMADA and were also destroyed. There was no insurance on these chattels.

No claims were filed against the deceased.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned above appear on this file.

The above were ~~was~~ brothers, and the wife of Yoshitaro, living at 18th Avenue, Whonock. I think the properties were adjoining and that on Lots 19 - 21 NW Quarter, Section 15, Twp. 12, Map 1973, was destroyed by fire in May last year. This was the property of Kaichi and as far as I can trace, Lots 16 - 18, being the property of Yoshitaro, were not affected. Mr. Jensen was the tenant in each case.

The chattels that were burned had been inventoried but I cannot trace that any inventory was ever taken of Yoshitaro's things though it is possible that these were included in that of Kaichi and destroyed at the same time. In case you have not the "JP" handy, I am enclosing a list of what was declared by Yoshitaro and by his wife, the latter on September 10th and perhaps superseding that of the husband. Please see what you can find.
