GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 7149      Kichitaro NAITO, Dec'd.      Reg. No. 00807

Kichitaro NAITO died at Slocan, B. C. on December 30, 1944, at the age of 76 years. His file shows him to be single and reveals no relatives.

NAITO declared no assets to the Custodian and none are revealed on the file other than a few personal effects which he had with him at the time of his death. These had no monetary value and were turned over to the Welfare Department for distribution to needy cases.

The only claim filed against the deceased is for the sum of \$80.00 to cover funeral expenses paid by the B. C. Security Commission for his burial. They were advised on January 17, 1945, that no funds were available from which to pay this claim.

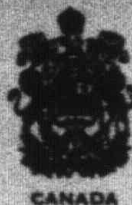

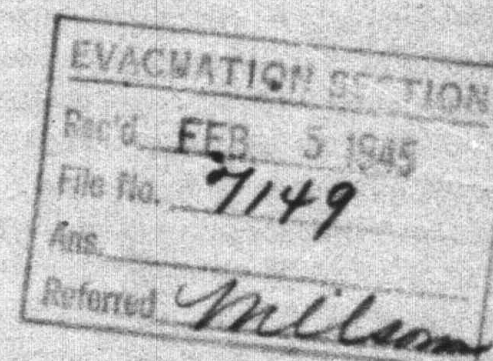
