GENERAL SUMMARY

This 61-year old Masseur, a Japanese National, from Prince Rupert, signed a Custodian "No Property" card on the 30th April, 1942. He is a Widower. He was evacuated on the 29th March, 1942.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: None.

Personal Property: This evacuee declared no chattels but claimed ownership of a few dishes and glasses sold by auction Aug. 3/44, the net proceeds of which (\$1.81) had been credited to his account.

Specified Articles: None.

Bank Accounts: None.


Life Insurance: None.

Liabilities: A debt of \$31.69 registered against this evacuee by Hirokichi YAMANAKA, File 9085, was rejected (Dec. 9/46) by Debtor, who stated that account had been settled by his daughter before she left Prince Rupert.

Funds: There is a credit balance of \$1.81 in this account at the present time, which is being remitted to evacuee today, and account closed.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.
