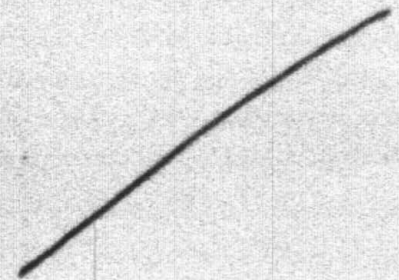

Mr. Shiyorin Nukina, (Reg.No. 07028)

Thank you very much for your letter dated July 30th from which we observe that Mrs. Yone Hisaki owes you the sum of \$64.94, that she is finding it difficult to maintain monthly payments of \$8.34 stipulated under the original agreement and that her note was endorsed by Mr. Kanekichii Hisaki and Mr. Shiyorin Nukina.

In reviewing our files we find that Mrs. Yone Hisaki declared to us on April 30th that she had no assets. Our file indicates that there are no other claims on file against her at this time.

With regard to Mr. Kanekichii Hisaki, one of the endorsers, our file indicates that he also admitted no assets. We have another claim on file against Mr. Hisaki for \$58.50.

With reference to the second endorser, Mr. Shiyorin Nukina, our file indicates that although we have a number of claims against Mr. Nukina which as yet have not been paid, there appears to be some prospect of our securing sums from time to time from Mr. Nukina's property which will facilitate payment of claims against him.

We regret that we are unaware of wages, if any, being paid at this time to Mr. Hisaki and to Mr. Nukina. It would be our suggestion that you communicate with the B.C. Security Commission, obtain from the Commission the present addresses of the three individuals concerned and also information regarding the wages being paid to Mr. Hisaki and Mr. Nukina.

Japanese Business

Referring to our letter of the 20th April last in which we advised that Mrs. Yone Hisaki owed us \$64.94, endorsed by K. Hisaki and S. Nukina, Mrs. Hisaki has since paid us \$4.00 (\$2.00 in May and \$2.00 in June) but claims that owing to the illness of her husband since internment he has not been able to work with a result that her monthly cheque is much less than it might be. For this reason she has been unable to maintain the monthly payments of \$8.34 called for under the original agreement.

Mrs. Hisaki, up to the date of internment, was a most regular payer and we had no reason to disbelieve her statements but we have not seen her this month although we believe cheques have been distributed.

Our purpose in writing you is to ascertain if you can give us any information in regard to the earnings of Mr. Hisaki as well as those of Mr. Nukina, who we understand was formerly owner of Asahi Paper Box Company; our idea being that if these two Japanese are obtaining reasonable wages they should be in a position between them to make up the regular payment of \$8.34 on the loan to Mrs. Hisaki.

Any information you can furnish to assist us in the matter will be greatly appreciated.

P.S. - As mentioned above, Mrs. Hisaki formerly made her payments in first class manner and while we naturally like to see this kept up to date we do not wish to be accused of harsh measures but we would like to see them pay the maximum amount possible each month.
