We have for reply your letter of April 19th relative to the belongings of Mrs. T. IMOUYE (formerly WATANABE), and regret to inform you that all his effects were recovered from the farm in conformity with the Government's policy of liquidation, and were sold at auction.

In looking over the file we find that about a year ago you asked that the washing machine, electrolux, etc. be shipped to Gault and we asked Mr. and Mrs. Ford Harvie to take care of your request in looking after the shipment. However it seemed that our representative visited the farm recently and was informed by Mr. Harvie that they were unable to make this shipment, and we assumed therefore that you had not required these goods as we had no further correspondence from you.

The items particularly mentioned were sold with the approval of the B.C. Security Commission and the proceeds will be available to you in due course.
