Re: Mrs. Masao (Mameo) IDE--Reg. No. 08704

With further reference to yours of November 13th, we regret to report that careful search has been of no avail in locating the effects claimed by the above excepting, of course, the gramophone and one or two other items which were sold in accordance with ours of October 25th. The effects of this evacuee were brought down from Woodfibre in May 1942 and were not clearly tagged. This was in the early days of the evacuation when these matters were handled for us by a Commercial storage company and not supervised by our own staff.

Under these circumstances, we agree that the deposit of this evacuee namely, \$6.52, should be refunded to her and we are enclosing herewith our cheque for this amount with the request that you arrange accordingly with Mr. Trueman.

We note that the articles which cannot be located consist of clothing and dinnerware. No decision has yet been come to as to how matters of this sort will finally be dealt with but we have at least on file a record of what this lady claims to have lost.

Finally, the items sent in mistake and held by Mr. Trueman. As these consist of clothing and cushions, we doubt if they are of much value and may not even be salable. Perhaps Mr. Trueman can arrange to dispose of this to the best advantage and send us the proceeds mentioning this file in order that we may have a starting point

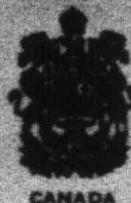

Re: Mrs. Masao IDE

I regret to report a case of shipment to an evacuee of effects which she claims do not belong to her. In this case the evacuee is the wife of an Internee and her effects were brought down from Woodfibre in May 1942. The effects of the Japanese formerly resident in Woodfibre were sent down en bloc by the B. C. Pulp and Paper Company since the accommodation was needed for fresh employees. The effects were not in all cases very clearly labelled and were stored at 992 Powell Street on arrival by Messrs. Crone Storage Company. While they did their best, we had at that time no men in the field to supervise this work.

We have not been able to locate the effects claimed by this lady and I consider that we must under these circumstances, refund to her the shipping expense deposited with the B. C. Security Commission, namely \$6.52. If you agree, kindly authorize the attached requisition and I will then send the cheque to the B. C. Security Commission who will attend to the refund.

Re: Shipment of Goods to Mrs. Messa IDE #08704

We have already had considerable correspondence in regard to the goods of the above party which she asked to be sent to her in August 1943. A parcel of goods reached them last month.

Today, Mr. and Mrs. Ide brought in the box containing the stuff sent to them. The contents consisted of two children's coats and seven cushions. None of these goods originally belonged to the Ides - they have no children so, naturally, the children's coats would not be theirs.

On October 16, 1944, they sent you a money order to the amount of \$1.52, thus discharging their obligations. Since, however, the goods sent to the Ides are not theirs and never belonged to them, I am wondering whether or not the Commission does not have some further obligation. They have paid \$6.52 shipping charges for property not their own and which they do not wish to possess. A mistake has been made and it would seem to me that the Commission or the Custodian should bear responsibility for the error and not put such on the shoulders of Mr. and Mrs. Ide.

Until your reply to the above is received, the parcel sent the Ides is being held in our office here. I shall await your reply with interest.

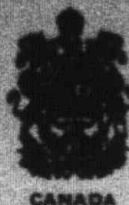
In this particular case, the portable gramophone was sold for \$14.00 in Vancouver auct. on August 9, 1944. Other articles belonging to the same person were included in the same auction, the net proceeds of sale of such articles amounted to \$21.54, which amount has been placed to the credit of her account.

On September 25th Richmond Transfer shipped to above from 992 Powell one box of effects and one carton which were supposed to contain a basket (kori) 2' x 3' x 1½' covered with white canvas and tied with manila rope. This had a tag attached with the name "M. IDE #09400". It was made of bamboo and it contained Japanese dinnerware and assorted clothing. It was originally moved from Woodfibre.

One of the parcels was supposed to contain a box 1' square with a small Victor phonograph and records weighing about 100 lbs. Mrs. IDE advises the cover of the box had been recently changed and inside of it she found a Richmond Transfer form, which is attached to a copy of this letter to the Richmond Transfer, indicating that they had the box opened. The phonograph had been removed. Instead of the willow basket she wanted, the paper carton received contained old clothes which did not belong to her. This carton was 18" x 18" x 20" and had the name "G. Kitamura" pencilled on the cover with her own name written in heavy pencil also.

Mrs. IDE is asking for an explanation of the disappearance of the portable phonograph and also requests that further search be made for her kori and the contents thereof. Will the Richmond Transfer please reply quickly stating whether they can say with certainty that the portable phonograph was in the parcel when it left their hands so that a claim for loss en route can be taken up with the railway company if such was the case.

On receipt of your letter of August 17th advising us that there was missing from our list of your articles, one spring of a sofa bed, we wrote to you on September 14th saying that matters will have to remain in abeyance for the time being. We have now written the B. C. pulp and Paper Company and they advise as follows.

On the list made by you, there is shown one spring and a sofa bed. On the Bill of Lading accompanying these goods they claim two springs and one pair of bed ends were shown. Two springs also appear on the Union Steamships' freight advice. This extra spring has, therefore, been in all probability, received at our Vancouver warehouse and in due course we shall probably be able to make a check and see if it is there.
