

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 2, 1942.
She was evacuated on September 10, 1942.

In her declaration she reported a quantity of foodstuffs and household effects. According to information received from Mr. Matt Brown, Custodian representative at Cumberland, everything of value was shipped to her on May 25 and June 24, 1942. This shipment would appear to have covered all the foodstuffs and all containers of effects. The cook-stove reported by this woman was offered for sale but could not be sold, and it was discarded. The heater, chairs, broom, brush and blind were sold at auction. There were also sold a crock, mattress and bed, which were declared by her husband, File 14710. All sale proceeds were credited to the account of this woman, with the exception of the proceeds from the sale of the heater, and this is being transferred to her account (\$5.00, less expenses). The net credit to her account from the sale of chattels was \$10.24. As shown in the Chattel Summary and Schedule some small articles declared by her husband could not be found, or were of such small value that Mr. Brown did not consider them worth listing.

She declared \$10.00 in War Savings Certificates in her own possession, and a Prudential insurance policy on the life of her daughter Michiko. These did not come under the control of this office. On April 10, 1944, the insurance company advised that cheque for \$46.50, cash surrender value of policy, had been drawn in favor of Toshiko KARIYA in connection with this policy, and this cheque was forwarded from this office to Mrs. KARIYA on April 15, 1944.

Mrs. KARIYA signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 2, 1942. Her husband, Ichitaro KARIYA signed a declaration on July 15, 1943. The same articles are in some cases listed by both. All chattels have been dealt with on the file of Mrs. KARIYA.

Releases on file cover what appears to be the foodstuffs and containers of effects declared by Mrs. KARIYA. On October 10, 1942, Mr. Matt Brown reported that everything of value had been shipped. on May 25 and June 24, 1942.

When Mr. Good was in Tashme in June, 1946, Mrs. KARIYA inquired about a number of articles. Of these articles the following have been sold: the heater, 4 chairs, broom, one blind, 1 deck brush, the 10-gal. crock and the bed and spring.

The cook-stove and stove pipes were discarded as unsaleable. The 6-gal crock was broken.

The following articles, some of which were inquired about by Mrs. KARIYA on February 24, 1943, and all of which were declared by Mr. KARIYA on July 15, 1943, were not found by Mr. Brown apparently as none of these were inventoried by him. 1 window blind, 2 oilcloth table covers, 1 sack of wool, 1 kiddie cart, 1 garden hoe, 1 mattock, 1 axe, 1 hammer and 2 wedges.

The net amount credited to the account of Mrs. KARIYA from the sale of chattels was \$10.24.

In addition to this the net proceeds from the sale of a cast iron heater, sold for \$5.00 and incorrectly credited to Mrs. Sadanori KIKUCHI, File 6836, will be transferred to the account of Mrs. KIKUCHI.

It would seem that, as reported by Mr. Brown in October, 1942, everything of value was shipped to this couple, as the articles sold were not of great value, and the cook-stove and pipes were unsaleable.

In regard to articles not inventoried by Mr. Brown, it should be noted that the sack of wool was not reported until February 24, 1943, and the other articles were not reported until July 15, 1943. None of these articles would be of great value.

Our agent reports as follows:

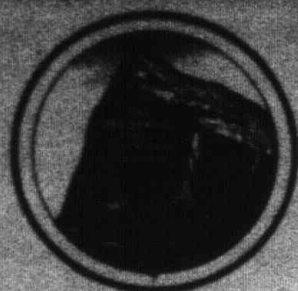

In answer to your letter of July 2nd. On checking up I find by our records that:-
2 misc. tubs were shipped out on May 25th/1942 c/o B. C. Security Commission, Hastings Park, Vancouver, B. C.
1 cook stove which was in Auction Sale Oct. 25/1944. Owing to the condition of this stove it did not sell and was sent to the city dump for disposal.
Heater #27, probably was the one sold at Auction Sale for \$5.00 listed in the name of S. KIKUCHI File # 4836 in error, as all these things were poorly marked.
1 - 10 gal. crock was sold at the same Auction. The 6 gal. crock was broken.
The balance of old stove pipes etc. were left at Fanny Bay and not put in storage as they were of little value.
