On May 30, 1946, the sum of \$223.43 was transferred from the account of Mrs. NAKATSU, at her request, to settle the balance of this claim. The remainder of the indebtedness had been settled by Mr. NAKATSU prior to that date.

Dear Sir & Madam

Custodian representative at Greenwood has written this office in regard to the inquiry made by Mr. Nakatsu concerning settlement of his liabilities.

As you are aware your two accounts show a total credit balance of \$381.73, while your total liabilities amount to \$533.30. Mr. Nakatsu has instructed this office to settle these liabilities from the funds to your credit, but as \$342.00 of the total funds to your credit are in the account of Mrs. Nakatsu we wrote her on May 13th asking her to authorize payment from her account. If we do not hear from Mrs. Nakatsu before her departure from Japan we shall assume that she has no objection to settlement being made as authorized by Mr. Nakatsu.

Mr. Nakatsu's instructions were that settlement of the debts to Mr. Kanzo UI and Komura Bros. be made in full and that the funds remaining be paid to Mr. Etsuji KARIYA in settlement of the debt to him. However, as we have not heard from Mr. KARIYA that any payment has been made to him on the amount owing to him and he has not notified us that he is willing to accept settlement of the whole debt for the sum of \$223.43, which would be left after the other two claims were paid in full, we shall consider that all three creditors are entitled to settlement on the same basis. If we do not hear from you again in regard to this we shall distribute the \$381.73 in your two accounts to your creditors as follows:

Kanzo UI	\$111.32
Komura Bros.	2.00
Etsuji KARIYA	268.41

If we hear from Mrs. Nakatsu, we shall have the funds distributed immediately. If we do not hear from Mrs. Nakatsu we shall assume that she was in agreement with the instructions given by Mr. Nakatsu, and we will make settlement of your liabilities in the amounts shown in the list above. This is your assurance that your funds will be used to settle your indebtedness.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 24th instant inquiring regarding Bonds which you say were formerly deposited under the name of Kii Kaigai Kyokai at the Royal Bank of Canada, East End Branch.


In reply we wish to advise that we have searched your file and that of H. SHIOMI, to whom you refer and also other files that might have reference to the Bonds in question but have not found any reference to them.

We called the Bank today and they report indications of having had the bonds but are of the opinion that they were surrendered to some signing officer of your organization as they have no record of the bonds being in their possession at this time.

As Bonds did not come under the control of the Custodian we would not, normally, be interested in their whereabouts if we did not know of their existence.

We regret that we cannot reply more definitely to your inquiry.

We are in receipt of yours of the 25th inst., in respect to the above bonds.

It is noted that you state that you enclose a copy of a letter received from the Royal Bank of Canada through your friend K. Sainote. There was no enclosure of such a letter with the letter received from you today.

As it appears that these Bonds were deposited with the Royal Bank of Canada, East End Branch, Vancouver, B.C., by you or someone else on behalf of the Kii Kaigai Kyokai, and as the Custodian does not appear to have had anything to do with the Bonds at any time, it seems that your best procedure would be to write direct to the Bank, as you say you retain its receipt for the Bonds.

It might confuse the matter for the Custodian to take any further action than indicated in our letter of the 28th March last.

It should be possible for the Bank to give you a satisfactory reply.
