

LIVESTOCK: The above Japanese declared chickens and a goat which he stated he intends to sell. He must have disposed of them prior to his evacuation as none came under our control. "Thank God!"

BONDS & INVESTMENTS: KUMAMOTO declares \$20.00 in War Savings Certificates. These were not brought under control by the Custodian.

He also claims to be holder of an unknown number of Maple Ridge Co-operative shares. According to the Financial Statement of the Co-operative as of August 31st, 1942 his equity in shares is \$117.00. The Co-operative is being liquidated by P.S. Ross and Sons and upon completion he will be entitled to his proportion of the proceeds.

LIFE INSURANCE: KUMAMOTO declares a Mutual Benefit Society, Class "A" Policy under which his wife is beneficiary. This policy was not brought under control by the Custodian.

The above registered with the Custodian on May 1, 1942 declaring his chattels at that time as follows:-Furnishings for a five room house; will take as much as possible; (also, garden tools, carpenter tools, farm implements, etc.)

The family was evacuated on August 27th, 1942. On Nov.2/42 our fieldmen, Moryson and Stinson, took a very complete inventory which included a very considerable number of items of little value or no value. A copy of the inventory was forwarded to the Japanese for confirmation on November 21/42 but confirmation was not received.

The property was tenanted by a family by the name of Wells with whom we understand the Veterans' Land Act was having considerable trouble regarding rental payments.

Neighbors informed our fieldman, Mr. Moryson, that the Wells family had abandoned the property and that the house had been wide open for some time. He immediately made arrangements and moved all remaining chattels to our Auction hall at Haney and on file is his lists of August 7/44 showing chattels missing and chattels abandoned.

A detailed statement of chattels sold by the Auction on August 24/44 is on file and the net proceeds obtained from the sale amounting to \$99.80 were credited to the account.

The Beatty Electric Pump system remained on the property as a fixture.

A memorandum of August 7, 1944 shows that three boxes of books and miscellaneous personal effects were removed to our Haney storage.

The son of the above, Takaharu, File #9351, also declared ownership to the chattels and in reply to his letter of May 1st, 1945 full details of chattel sale was forwarded to the father asking for a statement regarding distribution. He advised August 31, 1945, to transfer these proceeds to the son's account. However, as the proceeds were included in funds which the family agreed to use in settlement of the considerable claims filed against the father, the only funds available for transfer to the son was \$14.00.

Claims 1 & 5 & 7 were withdrawn by creditors having been settled. Claims 13 & 16 were denied and creditors were notified of no further action to be taken. The balance of the claims were paid in full with the exception of 3 & 8 against which \$175.00 was paid in each case on account after the family of the above agreed to have the Custodian transfer \$286.49 from their account to assist in settlement. The Beatty Brothers claim #4 was paid from the account 10/9/43 as the electric pump outfit was a fixture on the property.

A considerable amount of work was done in settling the above liabilities and Dr. Morse and Y. Morikawa were advised that no further assistance would be given them by this office to recover the unpaid balances of their claims.

Dear Sir:

In your letter of the 31st August, you requested that we transfer your credit balance to the account of your son, Takaharu. This has now been done and we feel that you would appreciate receiving a brief summary of our administration of your affairs which vested in the Custodian.

On 1st May, 1942, you declared to the Custodian that you and your son, Takayuki, owned property at Haney. This property was leased by you both to Wilfred Bannan until the end of 1942 for a consideration of \$450.00, and this amount was collected by yourself at the time. Mr. Bannan left the property in the fall of that year and the Custodian entered into an agreement to rent the property at \$5.00 per month from 1st Nov. 1942. The sum of \$10.00 only representing two month's rent accrued to the credit of your joint account as your property was sold as of 1st January, 1943.

You have already been advised of the full details of the property sale, and upon the back of said statement was endorsed a statement of the joint account to that date. Legal fees in connection with the conveyance of the property were later charged to the joint account. In accordance with instructions received in letters dated 5th and 6th September, 1944, from yourself and your son, the proceeds of the joint account were distributed to your personal accounts on the basis of 60% to the credit of your son, Takayuki, and 40% to your own account.

You declared ownership to a quantity of chattels which were found to be left on the property belonging to your wife and son Takaharu. Under the policy of liquidation decided upon by the Canadian Government, all saleable chattels were sold at public auction and net proceeds of \$99.80 were credited to your account. The Beatty Electric Water System however, remained on the property as a fixture. Three boxes of books and other personal effects were removed to our Haney Storage.

Your declaration to the Custodian revealed a number of personal debts owed by you. In addition to those declared by you, several other claims were filed against you. All claims appearing on your file were referred to you for confirmation as to their correctness, and the following are the details as they appear on your files:-

These accounts were confirmed as being correct by yourself and were paid in full from your account on the 4th April 1945.

Dr. Morse filed a claim which could be settled for \$327.00 and Y. Morikawa filed one for \$350.00. You acknowledged both claims as being correct and requested that we pay \$175.00 against each account, and stated the unpaid balance in each case would have to be settled by yourself at a later date.

A conditional sales agreement with Beatty Bros. upon which a balance of \$157.70 was owing, was paid from your account at this office, while T. Maikawa Store, whose claim was \$46.85, was denied by you as being owing. The creditor was notified of your denial and was informed that no further action could be expected by the Custodian.

In view of the fact that funds in your account accruing from the sale of your real property and sale of your chattels were not sufficient to discharge the claims before mentioned, your wife and son, Takaharu, authorized this office to transfer \$286.49 from their joint account to yours to assist in settlement.

Upon your making enquiry as to the sale of your chattels it was noted that your son Takaharu also claimed ownership to the chattels declared by you as being yours. On receipt of your letter of 31st August, 1945 in which you requested that proceeds sale of the chattels be transferred from your account to Takaharu's, we credited the remaining balance amounting to \$14.00 to his account. The balance of the funds in your account had been used in settlement of claims against you of which both you and your son were fully advised.

When making your declaration to the Custodian you declared a number of chickens and a goat, but these were presumably sold prior to your evacuation as none came under the control of the Custodian.

You also declared \$20.00 in War Savings Certificates and a Mutual Benefit Society policy under which your wife is beneficiary. These were not brought under control by the Custodian.

You declared yourself to be the holder of Maple Ridge Co-operative Union shares and according to their financial statement, it is shown that you are the owner of \$117.00 worth. The Maple Ridge Co-operative Union is at the present time being liquidated by P.S. Ross and Sons, Chartered Accountants, and upon

completion of the liquidation, you will be entitled to your portion of the proceeds, and at that time you will be fully advised.

We have attached hereto a statement of your account from the date when you last received one.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

I might mention that Kumamoto is a cripple and cannot work, the son ruptured himself about 6 weeks ago, he won't be able to work for another 3 months. What the other two boys earn just about keep this outfit in food. Y. Morikawa mentioned in Mr McAlister's letter also works at Taylor Lake.

We respectfully draw your attention to Article No. 51 of the Consolidated Regulations Respecting Trading with the Enemy (1939) which, for convenience, we quote to you as follows:

"No property vested in the Custodian shall be forfeited for default in doing any act or making any payment in respect thereof, or attached, seized or taken under any legal process or any distress, or foreclosed, or sold under any mortgage, lien, pledge or charge, or sold for any tax or assessment."

We must point out also that the interest of the individuals of the Japanese race mentioned above in the washing machines in question have vested in the Custodian. We shall be happy on your behalf to investigate thoroughly early possibilities of satisfying liens held, but in the meantime contest your right to take action intimated in the last paragraph of your letter under reply.


