He was evacuated on the 8th June, 1942 to Hastings Park. Our fieldmen inventoried this property on the 27th August, 1942. They reported that most of the chattels were looked in a room upstairs, and listed some of these chattels as being marked as belonging to Katsutaro ETO, a dresser marked as belonging to "S. NAKANO", and a carton containing dishes marked as belonging to "Shika". The only articles marked as belonging to GYOTOKU were a bed and spring and a large tin containing glassware and dishes, and the bulk of the goods were unmarked. A copy of the unidentified goods was sent to ITO who ticked off goods belonging to him, and GYOTOKU in his letter of the 3rd January, offered no objection.

all the goods were removed to auction, with the exception of 30 boxes and cartons of personal effects which were stored at the Buddhist Temple at Haney, and sold. The net sum of \$103.27 was credited to Unta GYOTOKU's account here. He identified "S. NAKANO" as being his sister-in-law, and proceeds from the sale of the dresser were credited to her. Katsutaro ITO's chattels were dealt with on his file.


