We wish to admostedge your letter of deptember 26th with file of correspondence attached from your Lethbridge Office. We are returning horowith the correspondence as requested.

First let me point out that the Custodian is not restonable for the maintenance of Evacuee Japanese life insurance, but in order to be of some assistance to them in maintaining life insurance, we sent out a circular letter a copy of which was adaressed to Mr. ICOMICEA dated March lith. This letter as you will notice, is attached to the file of correspondence. On the bottom of that circular letter we advised Mr. ICOMICEA as to the josition of his membership in the Pacific Union Mutual Aid Fund. Poliosing that we received a letter from Mr. YOUMICEA requesting us to may the membership fee for himself and his wife which we did on March 25th. We also gave the Pacific Union Mutual Aid Fund a quotation from Mr. YOUMICEA's letter in which he said:

"Please let me know promiums due me few weeks shead of time due so that I have enough time to pay promiums without delaying."

After saying the wes n March 28th, Mr. 103810EA had a credit balance feasining here of \$1.70. There was insufficient, as you can see, in the secount at that time to make sayment of the 1944 assessment and in any event, it was not due until July 30th.
