MEMORANDUM

To: Files

From: G. Girard.

On April 16, 1945, Kazuo MORI, File 4975 wrote that she had left five sewing machines at 139 Garry St., Steveston, two belonging to herself and three to her friends.

Ishiko MANUMOTO, File 7461,
Sadako FURUYA, File 6117,
Eiko NISHIMURA, File 1319,
each declared a sewing machine left with Kazuo MORI at 139 Garry Street.

We shipped two machines to Kazuo MORI on March 25, 1943. She wrote on April 16, 1945 "I have received two, one my own and the other my friend's, sent by mistake, although I had sent it to the owner from here". Miss Ishiko MANUMOTO received her machine shipped by us November 17, 1943. It seems then that the machine sent by Kazuo MORI to her friend was sent to Eiko NISHIMURA and we are writing to both of them to ascertain this.

This leaves, as stated by Kazuo MORI, her "old one and Miss Sadako FURUYA's machine". We sold two sewing machines, one on July 14, 1944 for \$38.58 net, the other on June 29, 1945 for \$46.20 net and, in view of Kazuo MORI's statement, are reversing these proceeds and crediting Sadako FURUYA with \$46.20 and Kazuo MORI with \$38.58.
