GENERAL SUMMARY

10th October, 1946.

Re: Yasuyuki YAMAURA - Reg. No. 13972

The above Japanese declared no assets and no liabilities when registering with this office.

Dr. L. Broe filed a claim of \$3.50 in Sept. 1942 against YAMAURA, and on referring to YAMAURA, he sent \$3.50 to this office in settlement.

The Provincial income tax dept. remitted the sum of \$1.94 to this office, being refund of 1941 income tax, and later \$17.49 being refund for first 6 months in 1942. These funds were remitted to him in January, 1944.

Subsequently a claim of \$1.90 was filed by W. Furuya Co. against a Mr. YAMAURA at the address given by the above Japanese, but no reply was received from an enquiry made to YAMAURA, and the Company was notified that no further action would be taken by this office and collection would have to be made direct.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.
