

Mrs. Moriyama declared that her effects, listed on the Chattel Schedule, were left at Lin's Store, Fraser Mills and at "Toda's", #20 House, Fraser Mills. They were not inventoried by the Custodian, those at Lin's Store being locked in a garage.

Prior to Custodian's auction of August 30, 1944, the effects found in the garage were removed to auction rooms and sold, realizing the net sum of \$16.68 as per sales sheets on file. This amount was credited to Ayako Moriyama.

A great many of Mrs. Moriyama's possessions were not found by the Custodian at the designated places and it is assumed that Mrs. Moriyama disposed of them herself before evacuation.

All effects found in a shed near Lin's store, Fraser Mills, were removed to auction rooms and sold.

It will be noted that the Columbia gramophone and Singer Sewing Machine were not found, also list of articles missing, on separate sheet. Lin Sing, Chinese storekeeper, was questioned about these but could give no explanation. There were some goods with T. TODA's name on, taken out. (79554)

The file may therefore be closed insofar as chattels are concerned.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 26th inst. making claim for recovery of the sum of \$80.00 from the estate of the above deceased to cover the cost of funeral expenses paid by the Commission. This has been lodged in her file and that of her husband, and will receive appropriate attention.

At the time of filing the registration form, dated May 4th, 1942, she declared as having ten war savings certificates of \$5.00 each in her possession, and also that she had some household effects stored. No check of these effects has been made and the quantity and quality of same is unknown.

The husband, Tsuneki MORIYAMA, Reg. No. 08633, has not filed any declaration with the Custodian, although he has been written to a number of times in that regard. He is represented as a millhand.

The U. S. Security Commission filed a claim for \$20.00 on June 29, 1944, on account of funeral expenses for Mrs. Ayako Moriyan (deceased). As the Custodian had no funds belonging to Mrs. Ayako Moriyan, the Department of Labour advised this office on July 17, 1944 that they would assume the funeral expenses.

Upon being advised on July 13, 1946, that Mrs. Moriyan's effects had been sold and the sum of \$16.68 credited to her account, and as there was a credit balance of \$5.38 in Tsuneki Moriyan's account, the Department of Labour notified the Custodian by telephone that they wished to collect these amounts on their claim.
