Dear Mr. McWilliams:

We have a request from the B. C. Security Commission to ship 3 bedsteads, 1 cupboard and garden tools to K. IWABUCHI, at Taber, Alberta.

These effects were the property of Kiyoko MARUYAMA and were left in your care at the Japanese United Church at Queensborough.

We have been advised however that you removed all the Japanese effects from this location and, therefore, would ask that you be kind enough to ship the articles mentioned to Mr. IWABUCHI. The freight charges should be prepaid and the bill for same sent to the B.C. Security Commission, unless you already know about this shipment and have this provided for.

In connection with all the Japanese effects left with you will you please let us have a memorandum listing everything you took under your care and a separate list of whatever effects you have shipped since the evacuation. These you will understand, are required to clear our files.
