Dear Madam:

We enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the amount of \$30.15 which is the balance of your credit and will close your account in this office.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that you declared to the Custodian on May 4, 1942 that you had no property whatsoever in the protected area of British Columbia. However, you had signed a declaration on April 4, 1942 in which you stated that certain items of furniture and household effects were stored with Mr. S. Sawada at 1019 Auckland Street, New Westminster. When goods were removed from 1019 Auckland Street a few things were identified as yours and in accordance with Government regulations these goods were sold at public auction. After deducting items which you state did not belong to you the net sum realized was \$36.65 for your credit. At your request a sewing machine, record player, mirror and beds which you had not declared to the Custodian but left with friends, were shipped to you together with a record cabinet and records. In this connection the sum of \$6.50 for cartage and shipping has been charged to your account leaving a balance of \$30.15, the amount of the enclosed cheque.

The \$50 Dominion of Canada Victory Bond and eight \$5 War Savings Certificates declared by you to be in your possession were not brought under control by the Custodian.

In the course of our correspondence with you you advised us in your letters of November 26, 1945 and August 11, 1946 that all your goods with the exception of a seven piece Cherry set had been accounted for by the Custodian. As apparently after declaring your goods to be at 1019 Auckland Street, portions of it were moved to various other places by yourself or your friends the Custodian is not in a position to report on this item beyond stating that it did not come into our possession.

We enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in acknowledging the enclosed cheque.

Two shipments of her effects were made, one to Kaslo and another to Fort William on which freight and cartage charges of \$6.50 were paid and charged to her account.

The above person made a declaration on her J. P. form on April 4th., 1942 and again on J. Form on May 4, 1942. On the latter she declared that she had no property of any kind in the protected area of British Columbia. She was evacuated on May 13, 1942.

Her declaration of April 4, 1942 states that certain furniture belonging to her was stored with S. SAWADA, 1019 Auckland St., New Westminster and the file reveals however that 4 Chests of drawers, a china cabinet and a desk were stored at the Custodian Storage at 318 Boyne St., New Westminster by S. SUNOHARA. Her husband, Shigeso SUNOHARA, File 15230 declared that he had no property remaining in the protected area and it is assumed that the foregoing effects were taken away from 1019 Auckland St., by him to 318 Boyne St. The dressers and china cabinet were removed to our Auction rooms in New Westminster and sold on November 26, 1943 realizing the net sum of \$27.18 which was placed to the credit of Keiko SUNOHARA as per sales sheets on this file.

Certain other effects, *listed on May 12/44* identified as belonging to Mrs. Keiko SUNOHARA were removed from 1019 Auckland St. and sold at New Westminster Auction 11, May 17, 1944 and Auction Surrey 11, April 12, 1945 as per sales sheets on file. The sales proceeds totalling \$9.47 were credited to this account.

A Sewing Machine and R. G. A. Victor Player were shipped to Mrs. SUNOHARA on March 11, 1944 and although she did not declare them, 2 complete beds ~~and 2 picture frames~~ as well as a mirror were shipped at her request from the houses of R. Stone, Fraser Mills, and Mr. Hamilton, Clark Road, New Westminster, to her at Fort William. Mrs. SUNOHARA admitted in her letter of November 26, 1945 and August 11, 1946 that all her effects with the exception of a "Cherry Set" were accounted for by the Custodian. The "Cherry Set" could not be identified amongst the items sold.

*2 Trunks were shipped by Mr. Stone.*  
The sum of \$6.50 was paid to Dove Messenger & Delivery System for forwarding charges on shipments and was charged to Mrs. SUNOHARA.
