I, Tadao YOSHIDA, Fisherman, formerly of Steveston, in the Province of British Columbia, now residing at Midway, in the Province of British Columbia, do solemnly declare:

1. That I owned a radio, Northern Electric Mantel Radio No. 1044, and have personal knowledge of the facts herein declared.

2. That I had in my possession and control at Steveston, British Columbia, Northern Electric Mantel Radio No. 1044.

3. On the 10th day of March, 1942, Roy Tsunehiro OTANI, of Steveston, British Columbia, delivered the said radio, on my behalf, to D. E. McLaren, Constable of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and obtained a receipt therefor.

4. That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipt in all repositories where such receipt might be. I have not found the same and I verily believe that the said receipt has been lost beyond recovery or destroyed.

5. That I have not in any way dealt with the said receipt or papers relating to the said radio and have not pledged or hypothecated the same or lodged the receipt with any person, firm or corporation as security.

6. That the sole reason for the non-production of the receipt is that it has been lost or accidentally destroyed.

7. That I have been informed that my radio has been sold for the net sum of \$29.52.

8. That I, Tadao YOSHIDA, the owner, am therefore now entitled to the proceeds of such sale, amounting to \$29.52.

AND I make this solemn declaration, conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.

MEMORANDUM: Files 7611 & 1369

Re: Tadao YOSHIDA #06044 & Yasumatsu YOSHIDA #03727

Although Tadao YOSHIDA is registered as a fisherman, self-employed, there is no record of a fishing vessel belonging to him.

However, his brother, Yoshiharu YOSHIDA, did sell the vessel "White Rose". This vessel was licensed at New Westminster on April 29, 1935, in the name of Y. Yoshida, Box 222, Steveston. As Yoshiharu YOSHIDA was born in 1920, it is probable that the licensed owner was his father, Yasumatsu YOSHIDA. This boat had been attached to Imperial Cannery (B. C. Packers Ltd.) and according to their records the owner was Yasumatsu YOSHIDA. Yasumatsu YOSHIDA is an elderly man, and he has been living with his son. Sale of the boat by Yoshiharu, no doubt, was made with the knowledge and consent of the licensed owner.

Tadao YOSHIDA did not declare a vessel. If he was a self-employed fisherman, he either sold his boat privately or else the boat he was operating was not licensed in his own name. He may have been operating the vessel "White Rose" in partnership with his brother.

Signature on receipt for the proceeds of the sale of this vessel resembles that of Tadao YOSHIDA.

Dear Sir:

Thank you for your letter of October 5th in which you request that we send you the money received from the sale of your radio.

The paper you enclosed with your letter is not a receipt. You should have received from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police constable, to whom the radio was surrendered, a receipt which would give a description of the radio, the date on which it was surrendered, and the name of the person by whom it was handed to the police.

We believe that the radio about which you have asked was handed to the police by Roy T. OTANI, and it is possible that the receipt is still in Mr. Otani's possession. The address of Mr. Otani is,

We shall be pleased to send you the money received from the sale of the radio when we receive the receipt signed by the police constable to whom the radio was surrendered. In the meantime, we are returning the paper which you sent to us, as this paper bears only the Serial Number and your name and address. This paper is not a receipt.
