



The above three claims are identical, each being for one third of the Real Property jointly owned by the three brothers, Iutaka, Tatso and Mitsure Mishiyams, together with chattels thereon. This property was a fruit farm at 745 Oliver Road, R. R. No. 1, New Westminster, on which was situated a four-room dwelling. From information obtained from the R.C.M.P. it appears that this farm was operated by their father Yoshisaemon Mishiyams, a Japanese Matiemal. Mitsuru, the youngest son, appears to have lived on the farm with his parents; Tatsue, in his J.P. Declaration, gave his address as 1424 Commercial Drive, Vancouver, and his occupation as Labourer and farmer; and Iutaka, according to information supplied by the R.C.M.P. was a Millhand at Moodfibre, B. C.

Tutaka Mishiyama declared the household furniture and a list of Orchard equipment left for use of the tenant(see declaration on claim file). Tatsue also declared most of these same chattels. Mitsuru Mishiyama signed a No Property declaration card. (as also did the father).

Before their evacuation, the Real Property was leased by the owners to Francis Gerlack from April 13, 1942, for the duration of the war, consideration being \$550.00 for the first year plus taxes, and \$150.00 yearly thereafter, plus taxes, water rates, gas, light and telephone. A large number of household effects and farm implements and tools were left for the use of the tenant (list signed by Gerlack attached). The property was sold to the V.L.A. as at January 1, 1943 and the lease turned over to them.

A few items of household furniture and effects which were not in use by the temant were sold at Surray Auction No. 7 on October 27, 1944. In February 1946 when Gerlack vacated, some of the more valuable items of farm equipment were recovered and appraised by Trapp Motors Ltd. (appraisal on claim file) and advertised for sale by Public Tender (copy of advertisement on claim file). and sold to the highest bidders (bids received on claim file). It appears, however, that a large quantity of goods was not recovered. In a telephone conversation with Nr. W. E. Anderson regarding these goods he stated that the Japanese and his tenant, Gerlack, were believed to have been in direct communication after the evacuation and he believes that a quantity of goods may have been sent to the Mishiyamas by Gerlack. There is nothing on file to substantiate this belief. Mr. Anderson also stated that the Japanese and raspbarry creates and fruit baskets which appeared on the Inventory and on the claim were, in all probability, owned by one of the Co-operatives and reclaimed by them as this is apparently the usual practice.

This claim for chattels appears to be based on an inventory of the goods on the premised taken by Custodian Agent, Moryson, on August 12, 1942, one copy of which, unfortunately, was sent to Tatsuo Mishiyama for signature (see attached).

At the request of the three sons, proceeds from sale of chattels were forwarded to their mother, Aki Hishiyama (see letter from Yutaka Mishiyama dated September 12, 1946 and letter dated October 19, 1946, signed T. Mishiyama & M. Mishiyama").



We have your letter of January 16, advising that you are acting for the rupresentatives of the estate of the above Japanese person. According to our file on this man, he owned a one-third interest in a percel of land which was sold, by special arrangement, to the Director, Voterans Land Lot, as at January 1, 1943. Cash protects from this source remaining in his account at the time of his death on December 30, 1946, were \$604.08. In his declaration to the Custodian on april 21, 1942, this man declared that he held thirteen \$2.00 Mar Savings Cortificates in his own possession. He declared also that he had delivered a 1932 Chevrolet Couch to the Fogg Motor Company, New Westminster, for sale for \$205,000, not. We do not know whether this car was sold according to instructions as no funds from this source have passed through our hands, neither did we bring the War Savings Certificates under our control, No other assets belonging to this man, in the Protected Area of British Columbia, have been brought to the notice of the Custodian. A Notice of Death, sent to this office by the Department of Labour, indicates that they will probably be submitting an account for funeral expenses which is, usually, in these cases, about \$80.00. Our file indicates no unsettled claims against the deceased. Then an Administrator is appointed, we will be pleased to transfer the funds at credit to him upon presentation of a Certified copy of his appointment. Before distribution is made to the heirs, we request that we be informed of the names of the beneficiaries in order that we may advise whether we wish the funds payable to them to be transmitted through this office. lours truly, A. 


