Reference is made to your claim against the individual mentioned above amounting to \$228.14. Mr. Maruyama has confirmed the correctness of the amount in question, but states that it was clearly understood between you and Mr. Maruyama that in view of Mr. Maruyama's inability to effect payment, you would be willing to postpone any action until termination of hostilities and until Mr. Maruyama would once again be in a position to effect payment.

This matter has arisen at this time as a result of the fact that we are holding the sum of \$8.43 to the credit of Mr. Maruyama representing refund obtained by us on his behalf from the Provincial Collector at Vancouver of 1% wage deductions for the first six months, 1941.

Do you have any objection, in view of the need of Mr. Maruyama and the need of his six children, to our forwarding relative refund item of \$8.43 to Mr. Maruyama at this time.

Referring to your file no. 7647, I would like to state that the claim against my father of \$1,721.10 cannot be paid till the war is over.
