GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 7656

Assets

The above Japanese declared a few personal belongings, some of which were stored with a friend and some at his father's property in Surrey. His belongings which were stored with the friend were shipped through the Department of Labour on the 3rd November, 1943.

The effects stored on his father's property have been administered under his father's file No. 1506. According to the father's file, the model airplane, a lacrosse stick that he declared, were apparently abandoned on the property, having been weather spoiled. The trunk, double bed and mattress were sold under SHINTANI's father's account by public auction, and some mutual adjustment will have to be made between themselves regarding it.

The above Japanese also declared a War Savings Certificate, a small bank account and two Insurance policies, but none of these were however, brought under the control of the Custodian, nor were they administered by this office.

Liabilities

Three claims were filed against SHINTANI at this office:-

Royal Columbian Hospital ( 2 accounts)	\$133.95

We wrote to the debtor for an acknowledgment of this account and in answer to our letter, received a reply from the debtor's father, Niichi SHINTANI File no. 1506, stating that they were correct and that payment could be expected from him when funds were available. He remitted a money order to this office for \$5.50 with which to pay Drs. Bowler & Cragg in full in February, 1943, and during the ensuing 5 month period sent five amounts of \$5.00 to be applied against Dr. Robertson's account. These sums were credited to Kazumi SHINTANI's account here (File 7656) and were remitted to Dr. Robertson on the 25th October 1943. The balance of Dr. Robertson's account together with both sums owing to the Royal Columbian Hospital were paid from his father's account at his request on the 25th May, 1945.

This file reveals no other liabilities.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

The upshot of various correspondence between this office, Niichi Shintani, and Mr. MacLeod (who appears to have the keys and be responsible for the farm at South Port Mann), is as follows.

Niichi Shintani agrees that the items set out in the enclosure to ours of October 20th (as well as everything stored in the house upstairs and the shed North of the house) are his (with a few exceptions. These exceptions are set out in our letter of November 3rd and Mr. Logan reports on December 17th that Mr. MacLeod is not disposed to argue the point.

Other items set out in the inventory of goods left on this farm, belong to Niichi Shintani with the exception of a few items declared by his son, Kazumi Shintani, notably a model aeroplane and one or two other items as shown in Kazumi Shintani's declaration.

Finally, Niichi Shintani appears to have moved everything from 102 Tenth Street, New Westminster, and the only other property involved are some encyclopedia and dictionary volumes, and one or two other items for which Mr. MacLeod has signed on September 1st on file 1506 and January 15th on file 7656. Mr. Logan reports on December 17th that they were left with Mr. MacLeod at 2358 Wall Street at Mr. Shintani's own risk and Mr. MacLeod would like them removed. This need not be done unless Mr. MacLeod presses.

This file (1506) seems fairly well cleaned up as to chattels, with the following exceptions noted on copy of inventory attached:

1500<sup>0</sup> of rough lumber unaccounted for  
6 sealed boxes (in house)  
1 china cabinet  
1 small chest of drawers  
4 tables, 1 box lamp shade  
1 table lamp

A quantity of books left in care of and signed for by K. Malcoed  
2398 Wall St., Vancouver.

The last two items may have been shipped to Shintani by Malcoed but there is no clear record of this, although Shintani says he received 'box of books'.

Kazumi Shintani had a model aeroplane, trunk bed etc. left in his father's house (Hiichi Shintani) but as the articles removed were treated as a whole, we cannot assign any particular credit to him. The model plane was abandoned.

Fraser Valley fieldmen are being asked to check on the articles unaccounted for. It will be noted that some effects belonging to K. Malcoed were sold along with Shintani's, but compensation for these is indicated herein.

Dear Sir:

Your file at this office has now been reviewed prior to its being closed, and we take this opportunity of reporting to you on our administration of your affairs.

You declared some effects stored with Mr. O.K. McLeod of Vancouver. According to our records these were sent to you through the Department of Labour on the 3rd November, 1943. The model Airplane and lacrosse stick declared by you to have been left in your father's house at Surrey, were found to be weather spoiled and were abandoned on the property. The trunk and double bed and mattress were sold by public auction, together with your father's chattels, and in view of the fact that identification was impossible, the proceeds derived from their sale, were credited to your father's account, and you will have to adjust this matter between yourselves to your own satisfaction.

The only other assets declared by you were a War Savings Certificate, a small bank account and two Life Insurance policies. These, however, were not brought under control by the Custodian, nor were they administered in any way by this department.

Three claims were filed against you here:-

Drs. Bowles and Cragg	\$5.50
Dr. W.A. Robertson	\$117.00
The Royal Columbian Hospital	\$247.40

Drs. Bowles and Cragg's account was paid through this office with a money order sent here by your father, with which to settle it. The sum of \$25.00 was also remitted to this office to be applied against Dr. Robertson's account, thereby reducing it to \$92.00. This balance of Dr. Robertson's, together with the amount owing to the Royal Columbian Hospital, was paid at your father's request from his account, and according to our records, therefore, no unpaid liabilities are outstanding against you here.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
