

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

CHATELS: The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on May 4th, 1942, and was evacuated on May 12th, 1942, declared that he had left a double bed, 1 fishing net, at House #3, Richmond Cannery, Steveston, in care of the watchman. His net, Custodian #871, was sold on Dec. 22/42, for the sum of \$25.00, and this amount credited to his account. No trace of the bed has been found. Our agent reports on Jan. 11/45 that this Cannery had changed hands and that the watchman, referred to by the above, had been gone for two years.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:
Radio This file reveals that the above owned a Westinghouse Console radio, Model 275, surrendered to the A.C.M.P. He wrote us on March 19/44 asking us to ship this radio to Mr. John J. Rilkoff, Grand Forks, B.C., in payment of a loan that Mr. Rilkoff had made to him. On April 7/44, Mr. Rilkoff sent us the promissory note in favour of himself, signed by the above, for the sum of \$50.00, in substantiation of his claim for the radio. The radio was shipped to him on or about May 15/44, and the shipping charges amounting to \$10.34, were deducted from the account of the above. It is noted also that our ledger shows the sum of \$1.00 deducted from the account of KARIYA for insurance on radio. See Specified Articles summary on file.

Fishing Vessel A fishing vessel, the "K.K.", N.W. 158, was found to be registered in the name of the above. This vessel was sold through the office of the Custodian on October 30th, 1942, for the net sum of \$319.25, and this amount credited to his account. Full details of this given on Specified Articles Summary on file.

On Nov. 22/44, the above asked for the balance of his credit. A cheque in the sum of \$332.91, representing his entire balance was remitted to him on December 8/44 with the approval of the B.C. Security Commission, and his account closed.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.


