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

The claim against Ichikawa by Dr. M. Uchida was later withdrawn.

The claim of \$185.50 by Palm Dairies Limited represented the unpaid balance on refrigerating equipment purchased from them by the above Evacuee. Considerable correspondence passed between the Palm Dairies and this office in connection with this claim, and as we were unable to get a reply from the Evacuee after we had finally discovered his whereabouts through the R.C.M.P. (he did not register until February 8, 1943) we took the matter up with the Slocan Supervisor and in February 1943 Mr. Ichikawa signed a Quit Claim declaring he had no further interest in the above-mentioned equipment. We forwarded the Quit Claim to the Palm Dairies and on February 12th, 1943 we received a letter from them stating they released this Evacuee from any further indebtedness to them.

Claims accordingly closed.

There are no other claims on this file against the above Japanese person.

We understand that Mr. Ichikawa of 1097 Granville  
Street sold his business through the agency of the  
Western Realty Corporation and we assume that the sale  
was effected under the terms of the Bulk Sales Act,  
and we also understand that our claim for the amount of  
\$185.50 was stated in the Bill of Sale.

Our Conditional Sale Agreement still remains

We have your letter of December 3rd, and have contacted the above man and went into the matter with him of JP forms, and also the Conditional Sale Agreement covering Palm Ice-cream refrigerating equipment. He claims that he had to leave his business in such a rush that he was unable to go into details regarding equipment and debts before he left. The business was sold by him to an Englishman, name unknown, who resold to a Chinaman, name also unknown. Old debts were taken over by the man who bought the store and the refrigeration plant was also taken over by the Englishman. Ichikawa claims that at present he has no property or assets of any description in the protected area, and consequently has not signed the JP forms as requested.
