

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

CHATELS: The above Japanese registered with this office on the 5th May, 1942, and at that time declared leaving household furniture, farm implements and brooders and incubators on property belonging to her husband at Surrey. The property had been leased by the Japanese to a Mr. Hubbard, and the chattels were listed and included in the lease with the tenant.

Our fieldmen inspected this property on the 7th July, 1942, and a copy of their inventory was sent to Mrs. GOTO on the 20th July, 1942, for confirmation which she returned signed, but stated that there were quite a number of articles missing as compared with the list made with Mr. Hubbard. A copy of this inventory was received from Mr. Hubbard and is on file under date of 20th October, 1942.

All saleable chattels were removed to public auction on the 14th March, 1945, at Surrey, and sold for the net sum of \$64.59, and at that time a Jamesway electric brooder was appraised by Trapp Motors Ltd. and sold to the tenant, Mr. Hubbard for the net sum of \$18.00. This sum was credited to Yasukichi GOTO, File 13566, Miyoshi GOTO's husband, but as all chattels are being handled on this file, it was transferred to Mrs. GOTO's account on the 25th June, 1947.

Two electric brooders had been loaned by Brackman-Ker Milling Co., as per Mr. Hubbard's letter of the 9th July, 1945, in answer to our enquiry re missing electric brooders. These were sold by them 20th March, 1946, for the net sum of \$13.50, one of which was in very poor condition.

On the 21st March, 1945, at the time of removing goods to auction, our fieldmen made note that he had left a number of chattels (listed on file under that date) on the property as being valueless. The chattels on this file are well accounted for.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE: Brackman-Ker Milling Company remitted the sum of \$4.50 to this office, being rent of \$5.00, less commission 50% collected on Snyder electric brooder. This sum was at first credited to Yasukichi GOTO, but was later transferred to Mrs. GOTO's account.

LIFE INSURANCE: Mrs. GOTO declared a number of Life Insurance policies when registering, but these were not brought under control or administered in any way by the Custodian, although enquiries as to their standing was made by this office on Mrs. GOTO's behalf.

This file reveals no other personal property assets.

In her JP Mrs. Goto declared the real property later found to belong to her husband.

Mrs. Goto, also, declared farming tools and implements and household furniture left at the farm at Strawberry Hill, Surrey, B.C.

File 13566 - Yasukichi GOTO #12603 - Evacuated March 13, 1942
Committed to Provincial Mental Hospital April 28/42.
JP, dated December 19, 1942, signed by one of his daughters (according to evidence at hearing).

JP reports real property registered in name of Yasukichi Goto, and also farm equipment. The real property is dealt with in the Real Property Summary. Rentals and proceeds of sale of real property have been credited to the account of Yasukichi Goto.

The proceeds of the sale of farm equipment and household effects were credited to the account of Mrs. Goto, and all funds from her account were remitted to Mrs. Goto July 17, 1947. Statement of account June 25, 1947, shows that Mrs. Goto received \$100.59, made up of \$96.09 net proceeds of sale of farm and household goods, and \$4.50 rent of a brooder.

Jan. 14/43 Mrs. Goto wrote stating she had no legal interest in her husband's property, except that before he had left for the road camp he had made a will leaving everything to Mrs. Goto and the children.
