



Replying to your letter of the 9th instant the writer has inquired from the tenants, Mrs. Robinson and James Lee, in connection with the furniture, et cetera, as per your letter.

A slip was produced by Mrs. Robinson showing that she had bought from Mrs. Sasaki the following:

1 heater	1 end table
1 kitchen stove	1 row boat
1 table	1 Coleman lamp
1 dresser	1 coal oil lamp

number of sealers.

The 12 chairs, one organ; one gramophone; two double beds and one single bed are stored in the house which Mrs. Robinson occupies. As for kitchen utensils and chinaware Mrs. Robinson does not know if any are around the property.

We might point out that a small building and a room in the building occupied by Mrs. Robinson is boarded up and a padlock on the door with the key, as far as can be found out, is in the possession of Mrs. Sasaki. If this furniture is stored in these rooms it is impossible to examine it and check the contents. It is quite possible the furniture is in these rooms but as to the value being \$325.00 I was unable to ascertain. (This reference to Sasaki's property left at another place. Mr. Green's memo.)

The carpenter tools listed at \$180.00 the tenant does not know about but informs me George Sasaki took delivery of a tool chest which she understood contained a considerable number of tools but where he took it she does not know.

In the matter of farm tools the writer checked with James Lee and was informed that no farm tools of any description was left with him, so that if they are on the property they must be locked up in this small house.

We trust this information will be of assistance to you.



Dear Madam:

We thank you for your letter of November 18th, 1945 and note your remarks about personal belongings left in your father's house. It must be pointed out again however, that we had no knowledge of many of the things you mentioned, viz, duck punt, jacks, lawn mower etc. and therefore, it would have been impossible to look for them.

We have taken all reasonable measures for protection of personal goods, involving considerable expense in the employment of caretakers, watchmen and night patrol but in spite of this a certain amount of vandalism has occurred and it may be that certain things were taken while the occupants of the dwelling away.

Referring again to your last letter of October 24th, 1945, you mentioned the following items: bed, chairs, baby buggy, tricycle, electric iron. These were all sold and appear on the sales sheets.

We note finally in your letter of November 18th, 1945 that you have agreed with you father that the statements of sales sent to you will be satisfactory and we have noted this in the files concerned.

We are returning your letter to you of October 31st, 1945, and the sales sheets.

No further action with respect to chattels mentioned on this file can be taken. Liquidation is dealt with on File 5963, and the Robinson family state verbally that there are no more effects remaining in the house. Mr. Green's memo of April 24/44 is self-explanatory.

MEMORANDUM

To: The Files

From: Mr. Green

Re: Mr. & Mrs. Shusai SASAKI

The husband declared a tractor and tractor attachments which, it appears, were left with the Dominion Drag Saw Company and some horse drawn implements which Mr. Mathers reported on June 17/42 as being stored in a barn boarded up for the duration and leased to Mr. James Lee. This is on the Lot 4, Section 1, etc. property and the tenant is now Mrs. Nancy Ball.

He also declared an organ and range valued at \$25.00 each and a heater valued at \$5.00 in the dwelling house on this property leased to Mrs. Robinson.

His wife declared the organ, heater and stove and a few other items of small value left at the same place, some of which have been sold and some of which are still there as per memorandum of January 4/43.

This memorandum makes no reference to Messrs. K. K. Reid's letter of October 21/42 which states that there is a small building, together with a room in the dwelling, boarded up and padlocked occupied by Mrs. Robinson - no record of contents. The letter further states "in the matter of farm tools, the writer checked with James Lee and was informed that no farm tools of any description were left with him, so that if they are on the property, they must be locked up in this small house." This can be looked into when the contents come up for sale.

This leaves only the equipment entrusted to the Dominion Drag Saw Company. Mr. Mather's report, referred to above, states "The equipment stored with the Dominion Drag Saw Co. Ltd. has been left with that company for sale and Sasaki requests that the Custodian check with that company from time to time to see if any of the items have been sold and that all payments be submitted to him through the Custodian's office."

On July 3/42 this company says that the equipment was "consigned to us by the above party and beg to advise that this machine needs overhauling and on instructions from Mr. Sasaki we are going ahead with this work." If the word "consigned" is correctly used, this would indicate that the owner meant the equipment to be sold.

On February 4/43, a call by one of our representatives revealed that the Dominion Drag Saw Company were willing to pay \$217.15 for this equipment, having presumably already sold it for this amount. This was referred to the Japanese in accordance with our policy at that time, on February 22nd and queried by him on March 1st, at which time he stated that the only acceptable price would be \$400.00, but that as long as he owned his farm property he desired to retain

Please note these two files in particular our letter of October 9th to Mr. K. K. Reid on both files and his answer of October 21st on 5963. A memorandum should be made on file 7732 covering the question of Mrs. Taki Sasaki's effects.

There are several points I am not clear about and you should get the previous Shusai Sasaki file and check up on the following, if necessary consulting Mr. Peers.

(1) What is the position about the drag saw (see our letter of October 2nd to the Dominion Drag Saw Company on file 5963)?

(2) Are the farm implements declared by Shusai Sasaki included in the lease of the farm to James Lee -- see perultimate paragraph of Mr. Reid's letter of October 21st.

(3) Which house is occupied by Mrs. Robinson as mentioned in Mr. Reid's letter of October 21st referred to above -- Mr. Peers will be able to help you with this.

When you have completed your investigations, please see that a memorandum is put on these two files so that the position of all chattels is self-explanatory.
