Dear Sirs:

With further reference to your letter of May 16, 1946, we wish to advise you that our Mr. Iverson misinformed you in our letter dated May 22, 1946, regarding the disposition of funds received from the sale of chattels found on the premises formerly occupied by you, in-as-much as said funds were not credited to your account as at the date of his letter.

Although you did not declare owning any chattels in your JP Declaration Form dated May 5, 1942, we nevertheless credited your account with the proceeds received from the sale of furniture and effects found at No. 8 Herzer Street, now known as 312 Herzer Street, New Westminster, B. C. Subsequently, however, it was noted that your wife, Mrs. Tsuji Hashimoto, and your daughter-in-law, Mrs. Minoru Hashimoto, declared effects as having been left at the above address. After communicating with them it was agreed that the sum of \$81.03 should be transferred from your account as follows:

\$61.03 to Mrs. Tsuji Hashimoto's account No. 7738 and
\$20.00 to Mrs. Minoru Hashimoto's account No. 7742.

Therefore, the proceeds from the sale of furniture and effects found at the house formerly owned by you are not presently credited to your account.

In view of the above situation, if you wish the proceeds received from the sale of chattels declared by your wife, re-transferred to your account it will be necessary for Mrs. Tsuji Hashimoto to write us requesting us to do so.

Please let us hear from you as soon as possible regarding this matter in order that we may close your file.

Dear Madam:

In accordance with the policy of the Federal Government in liquidating the effects of Japanese evacuees, we removed and sold at auction all the personal chattels found at 312 Mercer Street, Greensboro, (old number 6).

It was discovered however that many of the articles declared by you as being left at this address were similar to those declared by Mrs. Chiase Hashimoto, also left at this address. Mrs. Chiase Hashimoto stated in a letter dated March 19th, 1945, that she had left no property except a few cooking utensils, dishes and things left at 312 Mercer Street. We were unable therefore to identify and credit the sales proceeds to the various people accurately.

Under the circumstances all proceeds were credited to the account of your husband, Tsuji Hashimoto, for the time being. In order to straighten out the ownership of these effects we sent your husband copies of our sales sheets on July 4th, 1945, asking him to separate those items belonging to yourself or Mrs. Chiase Hashimoto. We shall appreciate a speedy reply to our request, and to expedite matters your husband can simply state the following:

1. Items on your sales sheets dated 30/8/44 to the value of \$^{61.03} were the property of Mrs. Tsuji Hashimoto.
2. Items to the value of \$^{20.00} were the property of Mrs. Chiase Hashimoto.

Re: Tsuji (Mrs. Tasaku) HASHIMOTO, Reg. 08176

Mrs. Tsuji HASHIMOTO made her declaration to the Custodian on May 5th, 1942 and was evacuated on May 15th, 1942.

She declared her effects were left at 8 Mercer St., New Westminster. On May 15th, 1942 she gave the Custodian four lists of her chattels, namely:

effects taken away with her
effects stored upstairs
effects stored in shed
effects left for use of tenant

She omitted from these 1 chest, 1 trunk, 1 stove, electric iron, carpenter's tools, and admitted taking away a Singer sewing machine, 1 heater stove, all of which were on her original declaration.



Prior to our auction sale of August 30th, 1944 all effects belonging to this Japanese were removed to our auction rooms and sold as of that date, realizing the net sum of \$81.03. The proceeds were credited to Tasaku HASHIMOTO, Tsuji HASHIMOTO'S husband, as the dwelling was owned by him and the use of certain chattels were included in the rental to a tenant. File 7742, Chisae (Mrs. Minoru) HASHIMOTO and Minoru HASHIMOTO also declared that they left certain effects, not specifically described, at 8 Mercer Street, New Westminster.

Not being able to identify these Mrs. Tsuji HASHIMOTO was given a list of chattels recovered and was asked to identify them.

Under date of January 13th, 1946 she indicated that goods sold to the value of \$81.03 were hers and that goods sold to the value of \$20.00 were Chisae HASHIMOTO'S. Transfers of these amounts were made to the respective persons from File 7713.
