Further to your letter of October 9th I wish to advise that I contacted the above mentioned regarding the letter you sent me from the Custodian Department.

Mrs. Akazawa advised me that the amount owing to the M. Nishiguchi Company Limited for \$50.00 was a debt incurred by Mrs. Akazawa's father before his death. The account with the Royal Columbia Mospital amounting to \$5.70 is the balance owed by Mr. Akazawa for his wife when she had her baby about three years ago. The other account with the hospital amounting to \$74.65 was incurred by Mr. Akazawa's father prior to his death.
