GENERAL SUMMARY



Mine (Mrs. Ryosaku) AKAZAWA'S declaration on a J card dated May 5th, 1942, stated that she owned no property of any kind in the Protected Area of British Columbia. However, as the result of enquiry and correspondence on this file, it was revealed that the Singer Sewing Machine Co., had in their possession a sewing machine apparently purchased by her but on which a balance of \$68.00 was owing.

The Custodian undertook to have this shipped to her at her request, which was confirmed by the B.C. Security Commission, upon payment of the balance due. An amount of \$68.30 was forwarded to the Custodian on June 8th, 1943, by the B.C. Security Commission and was paid over to the Singer Sewing Machine Co., who refunded .30¢. This overpayment is now being remitted to Mrs. AKAZAWA.

Certain claims filed against Mrs. AKAZAWA were stated by her as owing by her son, Satoru, against his deceased father (file 12523, File 7723) and are dealt with on file 12523. ?

Further to your letter of October 9th I wish to advise that I contacted the above mentioned regarding the letter you sent me from the Custodian Department.


Mrs. Akazawa advised me that the amount owing to the M. Nishiguchi Company Limited for \$50.00 was a debt incurred by Mrs. Akazawa's father before his death. The account with the Royal Columbia Hospital amounting to \$5.70 is the balance owed by Mr. Akazawa for his wife when she had her baby about three years ago. The other account with the hospital amounting to \$74.65 was incurred by Mr. Akazawa's father prior to his death.

Mrs. Akazawa informs me that her husband owns a property in New Westminster, located at 506 Ewen Avenue. This, I believe is a six room bungalow and nets a payment of \$12.00 a month rental. She wishes this money to be credited against the above outstanding accounts.

I hope I have given the information required by the Custodian.

This is to advise you that we have received a money order for \$68.30 on your behalf from the British Columbia Security Commission, which the Commission informed us was to settle your account of \$68.00 with the Singer Sewing Machine Co. The extra .30¢ which you sent has been placed to your credit in this office, and we have paid the claim against you by the Sewing Machine Co.

They are arranging with the B. C. Security Commission to ship you your machine, which doubtless you will receive in the near future.

On going through your file we find two claims against you as follows:-
