

CHATELS:

Gentaro MIYAGAWA declared on May 5th, 1942, on a JP form, that he did not own any personal property in the restricted area of British Columbia. However, the Custodian, in removing Japanese effects at 231 Ewen Ave., found certain articles, which, while they could not positively be identified as belonging to Gentaro MIYAGAWA they appeared to be his from the name MIYAGAWA given on some items. All effects found at 231 Ewen Ave., New Westminster, were sold at public auction and the proceeds realized from the foregoing goods - \$22.39 have been credited to Gentaro MIYAGAWA as per sales sheets on file. The effects concerned have now been identified by him.

Dear Sir:

We thank you for your letter of November 4th, 1946, which we understand confirms your ownership of the effects mentioned in our letter of November 1st, 1946.

As regards the other items you mention in your letter, we may point out that when you made a declaration to the Custodian on May 5th, 1942, you stated that you owned no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area of British Columbia.

In view of this statement the Custodian would be unable to identify any effects found at 231 Ewen Ave., New Westminster, even though they appeared to be yours.

We have now credited your account with the proceeds realized from the sale of effects mentioned in the first part of our letter and enclose the Custodian cheque in the amount of \$22.39, which closes your account.

We may say however that we still are unable to identify the following effects which were removed from 233 Ewen Ave., New Westminster.
