

Dear Sirs: Naomi TANAKA With reference to the claim which you lodged with the Custodian on the 11th of December against the above named amounting to \$153.00. We wrote to Miss TANAKA and she replied saying that she would be prepared to pay \$2.00 per month until your account is settled. This would appear to be rather a tedious method, but as the Custodian has no funds standing to her credit, and she does not appear, as far as our records show, to have any assets, it would seem to be the only arrangement that can be made at the present time. We are also filing your claim against her father, Tokikazu TANAKA, who is in an internment camp at the present time. We have duly noted from your memorandum of the 9th, the Bowles and Cragg have filed a claim against Naomi Tanaka for \$153.00 and as she has difficulty in paying, you ask us regarding the assets of Tokikazu Tanaka.

This man owns no real property and therefore, there is no revenue accruing. The debts that we have listed against him are as follows:
