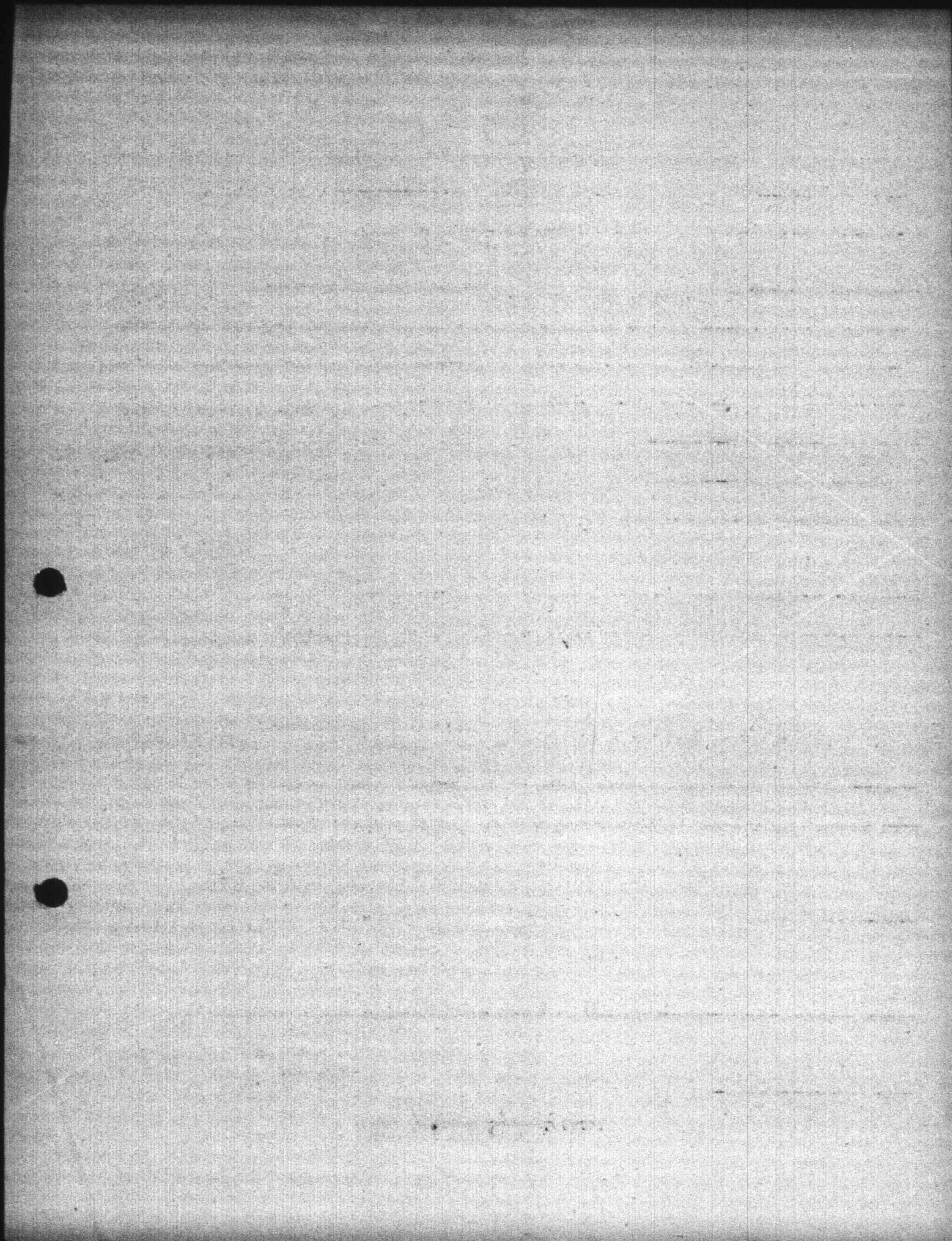

This person was 19 years of age at the time of her evacuation. She was a student. She stated in her declaration to the Custodian on May 5, 1942, that she owned no property.



I am in receipt of your letter of December 22.

In reply, I would like to inform you that I am very anxious to pay the sum and I would propose to pay the sum of two dollars every month, beginning January. As I am engaged in clerical work, I am absolutely certain that I shall be able to manage it.

This sum could have been cleared up by now if my father, Tokikazu Tanaka had not been interned at the outbreak of war on December 7. Ever since my father had been taken away on the 7th., we have had no income, we had managed to get along with our savings.

I like to advise you that it is useless to take this matter up with my father, as I have mentioned in the previous paragraph, he is interned and naturally he has no income from any source, as the internees are not allowed to accept money. His present address is:

We have duly noted from your memorandum of the 9th, that Mrs. Bowles and Cragg have filed a claim against Naomi Tanaka for \$153.00 and as she has difficulty in paying, you ask us regarding the assets of Tokikazu Tanaka.

This man owns no real property and therefore, there is no revenue accruing. The debts that we have listed against him are as follows:


