GENERAL MEMORANDUM

File 7805

September 21, 1945.

Re: Aiko INOUE (Mrs. Seihachi) #13676

When this person registered with the Custodian on May 5, 1942, she declared that she owned no property of any kind whatsoever.

Since that time, the only asset belonging to this person that has come to light is a credit balance of \$1.00 in the Bank of Montreal, Bancy, B. C., which was reported by the bank on February 19, 1943. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

The claim of the Union Fish Co. Ltd. - \$26.00, being handled on the file of Mr. Seihachi INOUE, File 766, has not been settled as the only funds standing to his credit in this office are \$3.00, received from B. C. Electric Railway (Security Deposit Refund). The Liquidators of the Union Fish Co. Ltd. (P. S. Ross & Sons) have waived any interest in this small sum.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with information on this file and File 766.



Dear Sir & Madam:

Enclosed herewith is Custodian cheque in the amount of \$3.00, payable to Mr. Saibachi Inouye, and representing all funds standing to his credit in this office.

The files dealing with your assets and liabilities have been reviewed, and the following information has been revealed.

Personal Property: Mrs. Inouye declared ownership of no property of any kind whatsoever left in the protected area, and the only asset belonging to Mrs. Inouye of which we have any record is a credit balance of \$1.00 reported by the Bank of Montreal, Hancy, B. C. in 1943. This small sum has no doubt since been withdrawn by Mrs. Inouye.

Mr. Inouye declared a small quantity of tools, which, according to information received from Mr. Inouye on November 5, 1942, were disposed of by him prior to his evacuation.

Two War Savings Certificates declared by Mr. Inouye as being in his possession did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Sun Life Assurance Company Policy No. 2239346, declared by Mr. Inouye, did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Accounts Receivable: The sum of \$3.00 was paid in to this office by the B. C. Electric Railway Company; this being a refund of Security Deposit. This sum was credited to the account of Mr. Inouye.

Liabilities: Two claims appear on your files; that of H. Furuya & Company for \$5.22 and that of the Union Fish Company Ltd. for \$26.00. The Custodian is taking no further action in regard to these, as you stated that you were unable to pay these, and your creditors have been so advised.

It is felt that we have accounted for all property of any kind left by you in the protected area, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the enclosed cheque, we attach a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
