Dear Sir:

With reference to your letter of April 14th, 1944, to Mrs. S. Ohashi (Reg. No. 08199) of Kest, B.C., regarding two electric phonograph record-players, I beg to request for your kind attention.

Since one of the said record-players belonged to this humble writer, I found great disappointment upon reading your reply to Mrs. Ohashi that the two requested machines were not to be located in her home.

According to your reply to Mrs. Ohashi's request for release of these machines, you virtually inform her that she is making an inconsistent claim; you impertinently write her that she has already taken these record-players with her at the time of evacuation and yet has asked for same from you. They were left in her home and should be still there.

Was not the tenant of Mrs. Ohashi's home
even the fact that she had trusted him for
some of her property in leaving them in
the house? The record-players were two of
them. I am unable to imagine that one
would dare purloin someone else's property
practically from right under the nose of
the "Protection" department of the Office
of the Custodian. I can only assume
that your agents and the tenant of
the house failed to locate these missing
● machines.

Therefore, I beg that you would
kindly endeavour one more to retrieve
the misplaced machines.

Please note that Mrs. Ohashi's
record-player is an electric "Victor"
magnetic pick-up type and the writer's
is an electric "Victor" crystal pick-up
● model.

I sincerely hope that you would
be kind enough to locate and send
these new irreplaceable record-players
to their rightful owners.
