

This amount was credited to Mr. KAMEGAYA as per sales sheets on file.


The chattel schedule and summary detail certain differences between the goods declared and those identified.


Chie (Mrs. Mohel) KAMEGAYA, a teacher in the Japanese School at 815 Agnes St., New Westminster, declared May 6th, 1942, the ownership of certain effects which she stated were left in the school. An itemized copy of her chattel declaration was sent to her on November 27th, 1942, which was acknowledged by *Mohel Kamegaya* on November 27th, 1942. However, on November 17th, 1942, the Custodian advised her that the list sent was in error and a list of the effects tagged under her name in the Agnes St. School was forwarded. This she did not acknowledge. This list omits D Room and B. Room sets, Piano and 2 stoves, and in a statement to the B.C. Security Commission Welfare manager at Kaslo, Mrs. KAMEGAYA stated that the B. room and D. room sets must have been sold, altho' whether sold by herself or the Custodian was not clear.

The Custodian identified as Mrs. KAMEGAYA'S certain effects in the Agnes St. School and removed these to auction sales as per the chattel schedule on file. Included in these goods were a piano and a few items of furniture, such as a table and dresser, bed and chest of drawers which might be construed as DR and BR sets (bed and table were abandoned as they were unsaleable). The stoves were not found.

It may be noted that Belyea & Co.'s list of effects state that the listed effects were removed from 1031 Royal Ave., but this is evidently an error as their bill is for listing, tagging goods and no cartage is charged. The effects were no doubt in the school.

Saleable effects sold at auction realized the net sum of \$101.79, and this amount was credited to Mr. KAMEGAYA as per sales sheets on file.



Herewith we enclose the Custodian cheque in the amount of \$101.79, which closes your account.

The sum remitted represents the proceeds realized from the sale of effects identified as yours, and includes your piano. In this connection we may say that the effects sold were found tagged under your name and it seems clear that you did not leave any effects at 1031 Royal Ave., New Westminster. From a statement made by you to the Welfare Manager of the B.C. Security Commission in 1945, we understand that you disposed of certain effects yourself before your evacuation. In any event we are unable to locate 2 stoves, a bedroom and dining room set, unless, in the latter case, these consisted of beds, dressers and chest of drawers, table etc, which were included in the effects sold.

Will you kindly acknowledge receipt of the enclosed cheque for which we attach a stamped addressed envelope.

Dear Sir:

Referring to your letter of April 4th, in particular that part concerning the piano, etc., would you please inform Mrs. KAMEGAYA that no bedroom or dining room suites as such, were found when removing her effects from the Buddhist Temple in New Westminster. We did however, find what might be considered parts of these sets, such as a chest of drawers, dresser, and these, together with the piano, were sold at auction. It may be that the full dining and bedroom suites were sold privately before evacuation, and to clarify the chattel situation, we enclose copies of our sales sheets and would ask you to please pass them on to Mrs. KAMEGAYA.

This completes the sale of everything left here insofar as we are aware. Notwithstanding the foregoing we note that Mrs. KAMEGAYA declared a dining room set and a bedroom suite but we have no relative evidence that these were actually in storage, and as a matter of fact Mrs. KAMEGAYA mentions that they were left in the school house, of which there were several.

We shall send the photographs (in albums) to her by mail.

See Mr. Iverson's letter of March 16th, file 7880. In a statement to our Welfare Manager at Kaslo, this woman said she believed the Dining Room and Bed Room sets must have been sold. From this it cannot be determined whether she means that they were sold by herself, or by the Custodian.

We thank you for yours of the 9th instant and in respect of your inquiry about the electric cord, may we say in reply that all your personal belongings, which would no doubt include this article, were disposed of some time ago in accordance with the Dominion Government's policy of liquidation. We are however endeavouring to find you a cord, and if we are successful will mail it to you. In case however, this was a special cord, it would be better for you to write the Singer Sewing Machine Co. in Vancouver and obtain one from them.

The foregoing remarks will apply also to your inquiry about other utensils asked for, but we can inform you that we have a box of photographs and a box of clothing remaining here in storage, and if you can obtain permission from the B.C. Security Commission to have these shipped to you, we shall be glad to do so upon receipt of the customary release, and provisions for payment of forwarding charges. *clothing etc. seen at Kaslo*

In checking over your file we find that you declared a dining room set and a bedroom suite. When clearing out the school house on Agnes St. however, these items were not disclosed and we are wondering if you took them away with you. We find that on Nov. 17/43 we wrote you along these lines, but received no answer to our inquiry. Will you kindly let us know something about these effects as soon as possible.

Since coming to Kaslo, we formed a Community Kitchen in our building, and shared and used each others thing. But again sooner or later we have to evacuate from Kaslo so I would like to have my Album, and electric curling tongue

left in the drawers.

Oxo - Numerous large pan & kettle.
Japanese teaset, ~~and~~ trays etc. which
are kept in a tall wooden box. As for
the cups & saucers, I do not want them
sent to me, because you could always
buy one. Kindly send me these
