The third Patterson, son of Stuttering Dick, is or was at the Brewery and has not fished for three or four years.

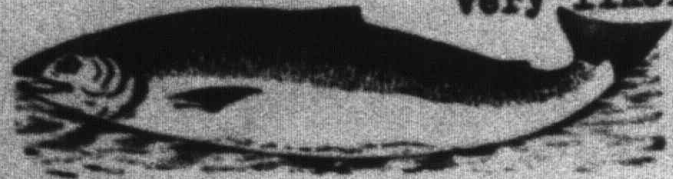

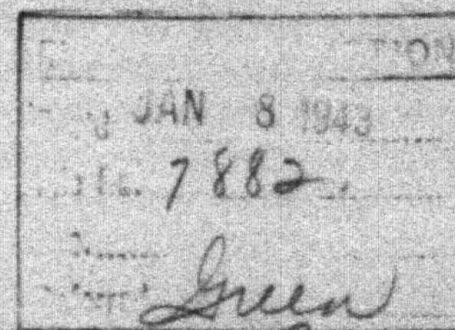

Referring to your letter of Jan 6th we beg to advise that the following items were left with us for sale by the above mentioned party who also gave us the prices at which he wished this stuff to be sold.

10. Globes. 40¢ ea.	All sold ✓	14.00

3 Priming Sops. 45¢ ea	Two sold ✓	1.35
4 Ring Plates .50¢ ea	All sold ✓	2.00

1 second hand sockeye net .	See below.	14.45

Against these items we advanced Hasebe the sum of ten dollars in cash. He was requesting the sum of \$50.00 for the net if we could obtain that much. In August we telegraphed Hasebe offering to buy his packing boat which was then in your care and offered him the sum of Fourteen hundred dollars for the boat and the net, our wire to him reading "Will you accept \$1400.00 for boat and net." On receipt of his reply your department passed the sale of the boat which was duly turned over to us in exchange for our cheque for that amount.

We are still indebted to Hasebe for the above small items less the sum of ten dollars already advanced. On the basis of sales value the items amount to \$14.45 and as they were sold through our store we are presumably entitled to a small profit of some kind which would leave very little still to come to Hasebe.

A letter dated 3rd Jan., 1949 from Oikawa reads in part as follows:

"Although we acknowledge Mr. Yukio Hasebe's claim for \$8.48, he will probably have record of the claim we file against him for \$60.00.

"We had sold to Mr. Y. Hasebe's father, a net priced at \$60.00 and had not received payment. Because of the death of the father, we had not collected. Since the questions of claims has arisen, we would like to press our claims against Mr. Hasebe. If he will acknowledge our claim we will send him the amount he demands from his claim"

In view of the above quoted letter it will be necessary that you provide this office with ALL details in re your claim against Oikawa, plus information as to whether you accept or deny your father's purported indebtedness to Oikawa.

Re: Expenses in Connection with Fishing Vessel "Putaba"

Miss Matheson, of our Specified Articles Department, has brought to me your letter dated June 17th in which you very rightly question "expenses" amounting to \$190.12 incurred in connection with the fishing vessel "Putaba". You are certainly entitled to an explanation as to the nature of the charges in question.

Insofar as all fishing vessels sold by the Custodian are concerned, no commissions whatsoever have been charged by the Custodian and the Custodian has in addition absorbed the entire cost of all proportionate office expenses and general administrative costs. This is a service to you and to all previous owners of fishing vessels which has not cost you one cent and which has been absorbed by the Custodian and will ultimately be absorbed by the Canadian tax payer.

However, a number of disbursements have been made by the Custodian in connection with all fishing vessels sold by the Custodian and these disbursements cover the costs of watchmen, towing, insurance, wharfage, pumping, appraisals by independent experts, etc., and the Custodian has charged against all vessels sold or unsold the proportionate share of such disbursement expenses and in assessing the share of these expenses chargeable against any one vessel has utilized a proper formula based on a time-value method generally utilized under such circumstances.

In your particular case the vessel in question was, of course, as you know, sold at the price of \$1,400.00 as a result of direct negotiation by telegram between you as owner and the Fraser River Fish Company Ltd. as the buyer, and in view of the agreement reached between both buyer and seller the Custodian aided in completion of the sale in insuring that the buyers received clear title and that your account in turn was duly credited with the \$1,400.00 obtained by the Custodian for you from the Fraser River Fish Company Ltd. Detailed calculations in connection with costs could not be made at the time your sale was completed; calculations were made later and your account with the Custodian was debited accordingly.

MR. HUNTER: No, I can't. The car was appraised at \$200.00 and sold for \$200.00, sold the 2nd of September, 1942, at \$175.00, I am sorry.

THE COMMISSIONER: No questions?

MR. HUNTER: No questions, my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: Thank you, Mr. Hasebe.

(Witness aside)
