We are in receipt of your letter of the 18th December and note that during the time the above evicase is a patient in the Provincial Mental Hospital at Escondale, the Attorney-General is ex-officio committee of his estate, and that your office acts for the Attorney-General in the administration of that estate.

With reference to the B. C. Security Commission Release of May 18th on the wife's file, she declared no personal property, this being registered by the husband. I see that we have on his file under Inventory #554 of June 27th, 1944, a basket of clothing and subject to this being in reasonable condition I think it should be sent. Would you kindly arrange with Mr. Fisher?

The items received from Woodfibre on the husband's file (Lot 114 of May 25th, 1942) are fairly well accounted for by auction sales with the following exceptions.

- 1 Crate cabinet) 7 2 broken cupboard
- 1 Cabinet base) condemned June 27th, 1944.
- ① 1 Table top, base, leaves
- ① 1 Table
- ① 1 Range and top (a stove back was sold for \$1.25 on December 15th but otherwise we have no record of what happened to this.

You might look into these matters at the same time as you examine the clothes.
