YAGI stated that he owned no property of any kind. However, a box of Household goods, weighing 100 lbs. was shipped from Woodfibre in his name. He was informed of this and requested shipment of the box, which he had confirmed was all his chattels in the protected area. Memo of March 26, 1943, states that although this box was on Crone's list of May 14, 1943, there was nothing in the warehouse book about this box, and that Crone's swamper had been unable to identify the box at the warehouse (March 26/43).

The goods sold at Vancouver 32, September 26, 1944, and credited to YAGI, would take a fairly large box and would undoubtedly weigh more than 100 lbs. It seems hardly likely that all these goods were received from Woodfibre in the name of Kakujiro YAGI. In addition to the goods sold a small heater of no value was discarded on September 26, 1944.

Please transfer to Chattel Suspense the proceeds of Vancouver Auction 32, now credited to this account.

On May 14, 1942, there was delivered to 992 Powell St. 1 box of household goods weighing 100 lbs. This box had been shipped from Woodfibre. Kakujiro YAGI, who had declared that he owned no property in the protected area confirmed on January 14, 1943, that this 1 box of household goods was all the property he owned.

On September 26, 1944, at Vancouver Auction No. 32, there was sold and the proceeds from the sale credited to this man's account the following articles:

Pie plates and etc.  
Tool box and tools  
Glass cabinet  
Bamboo rakes  
5 Chairs  
4 Chairs  
Chest drawers  
3 Springs.

It is obvious that all these chattels could not have been contained in the 100 lb. box.

In addition to the articles sold, 1 small heater, identified as the property of this man, was abandoned as valueless, according to a memorandum signed by you on September 26, 1944. Would you kindly check through your records to see if you can get any information that will enable us to find the correct owner of the articles which have been sold.
