PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Kimi(Mrs. Jinkichi) SUZUKI #09651

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 5, 1942, in which she stated that she owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

No real property interest is revealed in this file.

However, on May 7, 1942, Britannia Mining & Smelting Co.Ltd., Britannia Beach, B. C., sent us a list of chattels belonging to this woman which were stored in a company house. On November 16, 1942, August 5, 1943 and March 20, 1945, requests for the shipment of some of these goods were received from this woman. These were passed on to the Britannia Mining & Smelting Co.Ltd., and apparently shipments were made as requested, because none of the items requested were on the list of goods shipped from Britannia Beach to the Custodian, Vancouver, in June, 1945, when all goods remaining at Britannia Beach were sent to Vancouver. Goods received from Britannia Beach and identified as the property of this woman were sold at auction for the net sum of \$32.75, which was credited to her account. Two mattress received in shipment of June, 1945, have not been accounted for by sale, and it can be assumed that these were discarded. A baby carriage listed on the inventory of May 7, 1942, is not accounted for in any way, but may have been shipped to the owner with other goods. This carriage was not at any time in Custodian control.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

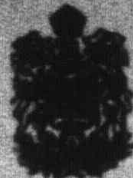

We have had a request from the above for the shipment to her at Greenwood of the following articles.

If you agree, will you kindly send a copy of this letter to the Britannia Mining and Smelting Company with the request that they arrange shipment? We have, however, no funds in the account of this party.

Whatever your decision, we think that perhaps the time has now come when we should dispose of the few remaining items at Britannia Beach and perhaps your Supervisor would advise Mrs. Suzuki to this effect. We will then in due course request the Britannia Mining and Smelting Company to make shipment of anything remaining at their end.
